### A BILL

## FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

- 1 "An Act relating to specie as legal tender in the state; and relating to borough and city
- 2 sales and use taxes on specie."

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

- **\* Section 1.** AS 29.45.650(a) is amended to read:
- 5 (a) Except as provided in AS 04.21.010(c), AS 29.45.750, and in (f), (h), (i),
- 6 [AND] (i), and (1) of this section, a borough may levy and collect a sales tax on sales,
- 7 rents, and [ON] services provided in the borough. The sales tax may apply to any or
- 8 all of these sources. Notwithstanding other statutes, exemptions may be granted by
- 9 ordinance. A borough may wholly or partially exempt a source from a borough sales
- tax that is taxed by a city in that borough under AS 29.45.700.
- \* Sec. 2. AS 29.45.650 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:
- 12 (1) A borough may not levy or collect a sales or use tax on the sale or
- exchange of specie. In this subsection, "specie" has the meaning given in
- 14 AS 44.12.400(d).

1	* <b>Sec. 3.</b> AS 29.45.700(a) is amended to read:
2	(a) A city in a borough that levies and collects areawide sales and use taxes
3	may levy sales and use taxes on all sources taxed by the borough in the manner
4	provided for boroughs. Except as provided in (d), [AND] (e), and (h) of this section,
5	the assembly may by ordinance authorize a city to levy and collect sales and use taxes
6	on other sources.

17	(2) a foreign government if, at the time of a sale or exchange, the
18	foreign government considers the specie legal tender and the foreign government is
19	(A) recognized by the United States Department of State as
20	being the legitimate government of a country whose existence is recognized by
21	the United States and has not been designated as a foreign adversary under
22	federal law or regulation;
23	(B) a subnational unit of a government described in (A) of this
24	paragraph that is authorized by the laws of that government to issue its own
25	currency; or
26	(C) an international currency union made up exclusively of
27	countries described in (A) of this paragraph; or
28	(3) the state government if
29	(A) a court of competent jurisdiction, by final and unappealable
30	order, ruled the specie to be within state authority to designate as legal tender;

1	(B) the state government considers the specie legal tender.
2	(b) A person is not required to accept gold or silver specie as tender.
3	(c) The Legislative Budget and Audit Committee shall study the possibility of
4	establishing additional forms of legal tender for the payment of debts, including public
5	charges, taxes, and other money owed to the state. If the committee determines that
6	additional forms of tender are practical and beneficial, the committee shall prepare
7	legislation establishing an additional form of legal tender for introduction.
8	(d) In this section,
9	(1) "legal tender" means a recognized medium of exchange for the
10	payment of debts;
11	(2) "specie" means gold or silver valued primarily based on its metal
12	content and in the form of
13	(A) coin; or
14	(B) bullion that is stamped or imprinted with its weight and
15	purity.
