SENATE BILL 1304 By: Standridge

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AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to higher education; creating the Oklahoma Workforce Education Revolving Fund; specifying source of fund; providing for expenditures; providing purpose of fund; directing the Oklahoma Department of Commerce to award funds to certain eligible institutions of higher education on certain basis; providing purpose of funds; providing eligibility criteria; allowing promulgation of rules; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

- SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2700 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund for the Oklahoma Department of Commerce to be designated the "Oklahoma Workforce Education Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by the Oklahoma Department of Commerce from legislative appropriations provided for the purpose of implementing the provisions of this section. All monies accruing to

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the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Oklahoma Department of Commerce for the purpose provided for in this section. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

- B. The Oklahoma Department of Commerce shall award funds from the Oklahoma Workforce Education Revolving Fund created in subsection A of this section to eligible institutions of higher education within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education on a pro rata basis according to the number of students enrolled in the institution of higher education. The funds shall be used to provide tuition assistance to students who enroll in or to expand instructional course offerings in fields of study related to the critical occupation areas identified by the Department.
- C. To be eligible for funds pursuant to this section, an institution of higher education within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education shall apply to the Oklahoma Department of Commerce in the manner and on a form prescribed by the Department. The application form shall include an attestation that the institution of higher education:
 - 1. Has not, except as required by federal law:
 - a. established or maintained a diversity, equity, and inclusion office,

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- b. hired or assigned an employee of the institution or contracted with a third party to perform the duties of a diversity, equity, and inclusion office,
- c. compelled, required, induced, or solicited any person to provide a diversity, equity, and inclusion statement or given preferential consideration to any person based on the provision of a diversity, equity, and inclusion statement,
- d. given preference on the basis of race, sex, color, ethnicity, or national origin to an applicant for admission, an applicant for employment, an employee, or a participant in any function of the institution, or
- e. required as a condition of enrolling at the institution or performing any institution function any person to participate in diversity, equity, and inclusion training, which:
 - (1) includes a training, program, or activity designed or implemented in reference to race, color, ethnicity, gender identity, or sexual orientation, and
 - (2) does not include a training, program, or activity developed by an attorney and approved in writing by the institution's general counsel and the

5	2. Has adopted policies and procedures for appropriately
6	disciplining, including by termination, an employee or contractor of
7	the institution who engages in conduct in violation of paragraph 1
8	of this subsection.
9	D. The Oklahoma Department of Commerce may promulgate rules to
10	implement the provisions of this section.
11	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.
12	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
13	of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby
14	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
15	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
