11 12	providing limitations on credits allowed; prohibiting refundability of credit; authorizing the carry forward of credit; directing the Health Care
13	Workforce Training Commission to award credit; limiting the amount of credit awarded to balance of
14	certain revolving funds; authorizing allocation of partial credit; authorizing credits not allowed to be
15	claimed in subsequent year; specifying eligibility for credit; directing the State Board of Medical
16	Licensure and Supervision, the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners, and the Oklahoma Board of Nursing to deposit certain fees in revolving fund for
17	certain purpose; requiring submission of information; authorizing promulgation of rules; creating the
18	Physician Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund, the Physician Assistant Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving
19	Fund, the Osteopathic Physician Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund, and the Advanced Practice Registered
20	Nurses Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund; specifying sources of funds; providing for transfer
21	of monies to Oklahoma Tax Commission; requiring apportionment of monies; authorizing payment of
22	administrative expenditures; stating purpose; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 697.5, as amended by
23	Section 19, Chapter 407, O.S.L. 2022 (70 O.S. Supp. 2023, Section 697.5), which relates to the Health
24	Care Workforce Training Commission; providing

1 additional duties; updating statutory language; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency. 2 3 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: SECTION 1. A new section of law to be codified 6 NEW LAW in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2357.409 of Title 68, unless 7 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 8 9 A. As used in this section: "Advanced practice registered nursing student" means an 10 1. individual participating in a state-supported training program in 11 12 this state that is approved by the Oklahoma Board of Nursing for the 13 training of individuals to become Advanced Practice Registered Nurses as defined in Section 567.3a of Title 59 of the Oklahoma 14 15 Statutes; 2. "Faculty preceptor" means an allopathic physician, 16 osteopathic physician, physician assistant, or Advanced Practice 17 Registered Nurse licensed in this state and who provides primary 18 care services; 19 3. "Medical school" means a legally chartered medical school 20 recognized by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education; 21 4. "Medical student" means a student currently enrolled in a 22 medical school in this state or a school or college of osteopathic 23 medicine in this state; 24

S. "Physician assistant student" means an individual
 participating in a state-supported training program in this state
 that is approved by the State Board of Medical Licensure and
 Supervision for the training of individuals to become physician
 assistants as defined in Section 519.2 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma
 Statutes;

7 6. "Preceptorship rotation" means a period of preceptorship
8 training of one or more medical students, residents, physician
9 assistant students, or advanced practice registered nursing students
10 that in aggregate totals one hundred sixty (160) hours;

11 7. "Preceptorship training" means uncompensated training in 12 primary care services of a medical student, resident, physician 13 assistant student, or advanced practice registered nursing student 14 enrolled in a training program in this state;

8. "Primary care services" means family medicine, geriatrics,
 general internal medicine, general pediatrics, or the substantial
 equivalent of such services when performed by a physician assistant
 or Advanced Practice Registered Nurse;

9. "Resident" means an allopathic physician or osteopathic
 physician pursuing postgraduate medical education at a program
 supported by a medical school or a school or college of osteopathic
 medicine in this state; and

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10. "School or college of osteopathic medicine" shall have the
 2 same meaning as provided by Section 631 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma
 3 Statutes.

B. 1. For tax years 2025 through 2034, there shall be allowed
a credit against the tax imposed pursuant to Section 2355 of Title
68 of the Oklahoma Statutes for a faculty preceptor who conducts a
7 preceptorship rotation.

8 2. Except as provided for by subsection F of this section,
9 credit shall be allowed for no greater than ten preceptorship
10 rotations completed in a calendar year, and shall be equal to the
11 following amounts:

- a. for a medical student or resident, Five Hundred
  Dollars (\$500.00) each for the first, second, or third
  preceptorship rotations and One Thousand Dollars
  (\$1,000.00) each for up to seven subsequent rotations,
  and
- b. for a physician assistant student or advanced practice
  registered nursing student, Three Hundred Seventy-five
  Dollars (\$375.00) each for the first, second, or third
  preceptorship rotations and Seven Hundred Fifty
  Dollars (\$750.00) each for up to seven subsequent
  rotations.

C. The credit authorized by this section shall not be used toreduce the tax liability of the taxpayer to less than zero (0).

D. To the extent not used, the credits authorized by this
 section may be carried over, in order, to each of the five (5)
 subsequent tax years.

E. The Health Care Workforce Training Commission shall award
the credit authorized by subsection B of this section to faculty
preceptors for preceptorship rotations of:

7 1. Medical students enrolled in a medical school in this state;
8 2. Residents who are allopathic physicians pursuing
9 postgraduate medical education at a program supported by a medical
10 school in this state;

11 3. Physician assistant students;

Medical students enrolled in a school or college of
 osteopathic medicine in this state;

14 5. Residents who are osteopathic physicians pursuing
15 postgraduate medical education at a program supported by a school or
16 college of osteopathic medicine in this state; and

17 6. Advanced practice registered nursing students.

The credits awarded by the Health Care Workforce 18 F. 1. Training Commission under paragraphs 1 and 2 subsection E of this 19 section for the tax year shall not exceed the amount deposited to 20 the Physician Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund created in Section 21 2 of this act during the fiscal year ending on the June 30 date 22 immediately preceding the date upon which the applicable income tax 23 24 year begins.

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2. The credits awarded by the Health Care Workforce Training
 Commission under paragraph 3 of subsection E of this section for the
 tax year shall not exceed the amount deposited to the Physician
 Assistant Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund created in Section 3
 of this act during the fiscal year ending on the June 30 date
 immediately preceding the date upon which the applicable income tax
 year begins.

3. The credits awarded by the Health Care Workforce Training 9 Commission under paragraphs 4 and 5 of subsection E of this section 10 for the tax year shall not exceed the amount deposited to the 11 Osteopathic Physician Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund created in 12 Section 4 of this act during the preceding fiscal year ending on the 13 June 30 date immediately preceding the date upon which the 14 applicable income tax year begins.

4. The credits awarded by the Health Care Workforce Training Commission under paragraph 6 of subsection E of this section for the tax year shall not exceed the amount deposited to the Advanced Practice Registered Nurses Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund created in Section 5 of this act during the preceding fiscal year ending on the June 30 date immediately preceding the date upon which the applicable income tax year begins.

G. Partial claims for credit may be awarded. Credits earned but not allowed due to the application of the limitation provided in this section shall be considered suspended and authorized to be used in the subsequent tax year and applied to the next tax year's
 limitation.

3 H. In order to receive the credit provided pursuant to this4 section, a faculty preceptor shall:

5 1. Claim the credit for the tax year in which the preceptorship6 rotation was completed;

7 2. Certify that he or she did not receive payment during the
8 tax year from any source for providing the training; and

9 3. Supply supporting documentation as may be required by the10 Health Care Workforce Training Commission.

I. 1. The State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision shall reserve Five Dollars (\$5.00) of every annual licensure fee received from allopathic physicians and shall deposit the sum to the Physician Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund created in Section 2 of this act for the purpose of providing funding for the credit authorized by this section.

17 2. The State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision shall 18 reserve Two Dollars (\$2.00) of every annual licensure fee received 19 from physician assistants and shall deposit the sum to the Physician 20 Assistant Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund created in Section 3 21 of this act for the purpose of providing funding for the credit 22 authorized by this section.

3. The State Board of Osteopathic Examiners shall reserve Five
Dollars (\$5.00) of every annual licensure fee received from

osteopathic physicians and shall deposit the sum to the Osteopathic
 Physician Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund created in Section 4
 of this act for the purpose of providing funding for the credit
 authorized by this section.

4. The Oklahoma Board of Nursing shall reserve Two Dollars
(\$2.00) of every annual licensure fee received from Advanced
Practice Registered Nurses and shall deposit the sum to the Advanced
Practice Registered Nurses Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund
created in Section 5 of this act for the purpose of providing
funding for the credit authorized by this section.

J. 1. With respect to each tax year for which any tax credit authorized by this section is awarded, the Health Care Workforce Training Commission shall electronically submit information to the Oklahoma Tax Commission, which shall include the number and amount of tax credits awarded and the name of the taxpayers that were awarded credits.

2. With respect to each fiscal year the State Board of Medical 17 Licensure and Supervision, the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners, 18 and the Oklahoma Board of Nursing shall electronically submit to the 19 Health Care Workforce Training Commission and the Oklahoma Tax 20 Commission the amount deposited in the Physician Preceptor Tax 21 Credit Revolving Fund created in Section 2 of this act, the 22 Physician Assistant Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund created in 23 Section 3 of this act, the Osteopathic Physician Preceptor Tax 24

Credit Revolving Fund created in Section 4 of this act, and the
 Advanced Practice Registered Nurses Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving
 Fund created in Section 5 of this act.

K. The Oklahoma Tax Commission, the Health Care Workforce
Training Commission, the State Board of Medical Licensure and
Supervision, the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners, and the
Oklahoma Board of Nursing may promulgate rules to effectuate the
provisions of this act.

9 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 10 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 495i of Title 59, unless there 11 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

12 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund for the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision to be 13 designated the "Physician Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund". 14 The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year 15 limitations, and shall consist of the monies received by the Board 16 from a portion of licensure fees received from allopathic physicians 17 under subsection I of Section 1 of this act. All monies accruing to 18 the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and the fund shall be 19 20 used to make a transfer payment to the Oklahoma Tax Commission in an amount equal to the amount of tax credits awarded pursuant to this 21 The Oklahoma Tax Commission shall apportion monies transferred 22 act. from the fund in the same manner as provided by Section 2352 of 23 Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Monies in the fund which are not 24

required for payment of administrative expenses to the Health Care Workforce Training Commission, which shall not exceed five percent (5%) of monies apportioned to the fund, or which are not required to be transferred to the Oklahoma Tax Commission as otherwise required by this act to offset the revenue impacted by the use of the income tax credits awarded pursuant to Section 1 of this act may be used to implement programs required or authorized by law.

8 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 9 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 519.8a of Title 59, unless there 10 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

11 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund 12 for the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision to be designated the "Physician Assistant Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving 13 Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal 14 year limitations, and shall consist of the monies received by the 15 Board from a portion of licensure fees received from physician 16 17 assistants under subsection I of Section 1 of this act. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and the 18 fund shall be used to make a transfer payment to the Oklahoma Tax 19 Commission in an amount equal to the amount of tax credits awarded 20 pursuant to this act. The Oklahoma Tax Commission shall apportion 21 monies transferred from the fund in the same manner as provided by 22 Section 2352 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Monies in the 23 24 fund which are not required for payment of administrative expenses

1 to the Health Care Workforce Training Commission, which shall not 2 exceed five percent (5%) of monies apportioned to the fund, or which are not required to be transferred to the Oklahoma Tax Commission as 3 otherwise required by this act to offset the revenue impacted by the 4 use of the income tax credits awarded pursuant to Section 1 of this 5 act may be used to implement programs required or authorized by law. 6 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 7 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 645.1 of Title 59, unless there 8 9 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

10 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund for the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners to be designated the 11 12 "Osteopathic Physician Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund". The 13 fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of the monies received by the Board 14 from a portion of licensure fees received from osteopathic 15 physicians under subsection I of Section 1 of this act. All monies 16 accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and the 17 fund shall be used to make a transfer payment to the Oklahoma Tax 18 Commission in an amount equal to the amount of tax credits awarded 19 pursuant to this act. The Oklahoma Tax Commission shall apportion 20 monies transferred from the fund in the same manner as provided by 21 Section 2352 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Monies in the 22 fund which are not required for payment of administrative expenses 23 to the Health Care Workforce Training Commission, which shall not 24

1 exceed five percent (5%) of monies apportioned to the fund, or which 2 are not required to be transferred to the Oklahoma Tax Commission as 3 otherwise required by this act to offset the revenue impacted by the use of the income tax credits awarded pursuant to Section 1 of this 4 5 act may be used to implement programs required or authorized by law. 9 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund 10 for the Oklahoma Board of Nursing to be designated the "Advanced Practice Registered Nurses Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund". 11 12 The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year 13 limitations, and shall consist of the monies received by the Board from a portion of licensure fees received from Advanced Practice 14 Registered Nurses under subsection I of Section 1 of this act. All 15 monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated 16 17 and the fund shall be used to make a transfer payment to the Oklahoma Tax Commission in an amount equal to the amount of tax 18 credits awarded pursuant to this act. The Oklahoma Tax Commission 19 shall apportion monies transferred from the fund in the same manner 20 as provided by Section 2352 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes. 21 Monies in the fund which are not required for payment of 22 administrative expenses to the Health Care Workforce Training 23 Commission, which shall not exceed five percent (5%) of monies 24

apportioned to the fund, or which are not required to be transferred to the Oklahoma Tax Commission as otherwise required by this act to offset the revenue impacted by the use of the income tax credits awarded pursuant to Section 1 of this act may be used to implement programs required or authorized by law.

6 SECTION 6. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 697.5, as
7 amended by Section 19, Chapter 407, O.S.L. 2022 (70 O.S. Supp. 2023,
8 Section 697.5), is amended to read as follows:

9 Section 697.5. The Health Care Workforce Training Commission, 10 in order to perform its official function in establishing and 11 administering physician training programs, shall have the following 12 specific powers, duties, and responsibilities:

To review all available data on health care workforce in
 Oklahoma in order to determine the current and projected
 distribution of physicians by geographic location and by type of
 practice, and, to accomplish this review, the Commission shall
 obtain information from and work in conjunction with the State
 Department of Health and all other agencies which gather data and
 evaluate health care workforce needs;

20 2. To review data and information on accredited physician 21 internship and residency programs currently operated by Oklahoma 22 hospitals and other approved clinical situations, in order to 23 ascertain the number and distribution by physician specialty 24 training and by geographic location of available internship and 1 residency positions and to evaluate the impact of internship and 2 residency placement on the establishment of practices by physicians 3 in that geographic area or similar areas within the state where 4 their services are urgently needed;

5 3. To serve as an agent to advise hospitals, clinics, and 6 communities on setting up and planning internship and residency 7 programs which emphasize the provision of additional primary care 8 physicians to service the rural areas of Oklahoma with primary care 9 specialties to be defined to include training in the area of 10 internal medicine, obstetrics and gynecology, pediatrics, emergency 11 trauma, and family practice;

12 4. To provide general counsel and advice in the development, operation and evaluation of physician internship and residency 13 programs throughout the State of Oklahoma this state in cooperation 14 with the efforts of the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education 15 and the state's physician training institutions such as the Oklahoma 16 University University of Oklahoma College of Medicine, Oklahoma City 17 and Tulsa campuses, and the Oklahoma State University College of 18 Osteopathic Medicine and Surgery, and subject to accreditation by 19 official and appropriate accrediting agencies; 20

5. To develop the criteria for determining the physician training cost component or associated clinical and hospital training costs which are or may be nonreimbursable by third party payers in programs proposed by accredited hospitals, clinical situations, or hospital and clinical programs affiliated with and administered by the <u>University of Oklahoma</u> College of Medicine, <u>University of</u> <u>Oklahoma</u> College of Medicine - Tulsa, or <u>Oklahoma State University</u> College of Osteopathic Medicine and <u>Surgery</u> in order to determine the share for the state in supporting the salary, benefits, training and program administration costs incurred by hospitals in supporting of the interns and residents;

To develop the criteria and procedure by which state 8 6. 9 matching funds will be awarded to hospitals, accredited clinical 10 situations, in cooperation with the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine, University of Oklahoma College of Medicine - Tulsa, and 11 12 the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine and 13 Surgery which shall administer programs in hospital and clinical situations in the state to be used to underwrite the salaries, 14 benefits and associated training and administration costs provided 15 for the physician interns and residents during their period of 16 training in such a way as to create an incentive for the development 17 and establishment of residency and internship positions by 18 hospitals, clinical establishments or by affiliation agreement with 19 the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine, University of 20 Oklahoma College of Medicine - Tulsa, and the Oklahoma State 21 University College of Osteopathic Medicine and Surgery by providing 22 funds to cover and to supplement the nonreimbursable or additional 23 costs incurred in hospitals for training activities or for delivery 24

1 of service in outreach and ambulatory clinical situations which are 2 outside but associated with the hospitals and clinical 3 establishments participating in the program;

7. To review and to approve for inclusion in the programs 4 5 funded the applications for funds submitted by accredited hospitals and clinical situations participating in physician training programs 6 in cooperation with the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine, 7 University of Oklahoma College of Medicine - Tulsa, and the Oklahoma 8 9 State University College of Osteopathic Medicine and Surgery for the 10 costs of supplying residents and interns in programs which they administer by affiliation agreements with hospitals and clinical 11 situations throughout the state in which the interns and residents 12 are supervised and funded by the University of Oklahoma College of 13 Medicine, University of Oklahoma College of Medicine - Tulsa, and 14 the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine and 15 Surgery and the hospitals and clinical establishments pay for the 16 patient care services rendered in their institutions by these 17 residents and interns during the period of training; 18

8. To determine the specific level of funding and the
 priorities used for granting state support to approved hospitals and
 clinical situations, in cooperation with the University of Oklahoma
 College of Medicine, University of Oklahoma College of Medicine Tulsa, and the Oklahoma <u>State University</u> College of Osteopathic
 Medicine and Surgery for approved hospital physician training

programs for interns and residents and to recommend to the Governor and the Oklahoma Legislature the total funds needed to carry out the purpose of this program;

9. To employ a director and any staff personnel required to 4 5 administer the funding of approved physician training programs and to contract with other state agencies and institutions to conduct 6 and to perform specified services, functions and aspects in 7 administering state funds on the specified cost-sharing basis 8 9 determined by the Commission or for developing programs and 10 community and institutional participation in these training 11 programs;

12 10. To ensure that hospitals or clinical situations that can 13 qualify in all sections of Oklahoma be utilized, and to take all 14 steps necessary to assist such hospitals or clinics in obtaining 15 necessary recognition or status, or in meeting standards for 16 accreditation or affiliation so that they may participate in these 17 physician training programs;

18 11. To ensure that in programs administered and operated by the 19 University of Oklahoma College of Medicine, University of Oklahoma 20 College of Medicine - Tulsa, and the Oklahoma <u>State University</u> 21 College of Osteopathic Medicine and <u>Surgery</u> in hospitals and 22 clinical situations throughout the state that funds allocated to the 23 colleges are paid by the hospitals and clinical situations in which 24 the patient care services are rendered, the funds are expended for 1 such purposes in funding residents and interns in the physician 2 training programs that the colleges have established with the 3 approved hospitals and clinical situations which programs are 4 designed to provide primary health care services to the rural and 5 medically underserved parts of the state;

To conduct and to administer a program of physician and 6 12. health care workforce placement services throughout the State of 7 Oklahoma this state. Placement services shall be made available to 8 9 communities, hospitals, health care facilities, physician and health 10 professional training institutions, health professional associations and organizations, individual physicians, health professionals, 11 students in physician and health professional training institutions 12 and schools, and other interested parties in such a way so as to 13 further the purposes of improving the distribution of physicians and 14 health professionals practicing or available for practice in the 15 state and improving in the availability of health care services to 16 the people of the state. Said The placement service shall include 17 but not be limited to assisting communities in matching with, 18 contacting and recruiting physicians and health professionals to 19 practice in communities in the state. The Commission shall develop 20 criteria and procedures for the conduct and performance of placement 21 services and employ any staff, contract for services with any 22 private agency, nonprofit corporation, or institution to facilitate 23 the performance of placement services; and 24

1	13. For purposes of the income tax credit authorized pursuant
2	to Section 1 of this act and in cooperation with the Oklahoma Tax
3	<u>Commission:</u>
4	a. to certify preceptorship rotations for allopathic
5	medicine, osteopathic medicine, advanced practice
6	registered nursing, and physician assistant training
7	programs in this state and to register faculty
8	preceptors who provide certified training,
9	b. to charge administrative expenses to the State Board
10	of Medical Licensure and Supervision, the State Board
11	of Osteopathic Examiners, and the Oklahoma Board of
12	Nursing pursuant to Sections 2 through 5 of this act,
13	and
14	c. to promulgate any additional rules necessary for the
15	implementation of this act.
16	SECTION 7. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.
17	SECTION 8. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
18	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
19	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
20	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
