## AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in terms and courses of study, 5 further providing for dates and times of school terms and 6 7 sessions and commencement. 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. Section 1504 of the act of March 10, 1949 11 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is 12 amended to read: 13 Section 1504. Dates and Times of School Terms and Sessions; Commencement. -- (a) (1) The board of school directors of each 14 15 school district shall fix the date of the beginning of the 16 school term. 17 (2) Unless otherwise determined by the board, the daily 18 session of school shall open at [nine ante-meridian] 9:00 a.m. 19 and close at [four post-meridian] 4:00 p.m., with an intermission of one hour at noon, and an intermission of fifteen 20

- 1 minutes in the forenoon and in the afternoon. Upon request of a
- 2 board of school directors for an exception to the aforesaid
- 3 daily schedule, the [Secretary of Education] secretary may, when
- 4 in his opinion a meritorious educational program warrants,
- 5 approve a school week containing a minimum of twenty seven and
- 6 one-half hours of instruction as the equivalent of five (5)
- 7 school days, or a school year containing a minimum of nine
- 8 hundred ninety hours of instruction at the secondary level or
- 9 nine hundred (900) hours of instruction at the elementary level
- 10 as the equivalent of one hundred eighty (180) school days.
- 11 (3) Beginning with the 2026-2027 school year, and each
- 12 <u>school year thereafter, the instructional day for a secondary</u>
- 13 school may not begin earlier than 8:15 a.m. By July 1, 2026, the
- 14 governing body of a public school entity shall inform its
- 15 community, including parents, students, school administrators,
- 16 school employes and other stakeholders, about the health, safety
- 17 <u>and academic impacts of sleep deprivation on secondary school</u>
- 18 students and the benefits of a later school start time, and
- 19 shall discuss with the community local strategies to
- 20 <u>successfully implement the later school start time.</u>
- 21 (4) Professional and temporary professional employes shall
- 22 be allowed a lunch period free of supervisory or other duties of
- 23 at least thirty minutes.
- 24 <u>(5)</u> The provisions of this subsection shall not be construed
- 25 to repeal any rule or regulation of any board of school
- 26 directors now in effect which provides for a lunch period longer
- 27 than the minimum prescribed [herein] in this section or to
- 28 repeal any action of any board of school directors taken in
- 29 compliance with section 7 of the act of July 25, 1913 (P.L.1024,
- 30 No.466), entitled "An act to protect the public health and

- 1 welfare, by regulating the employment of females in certain
- 2 establishments, with respect to their hours of labor and the
- 3 conditions of their employment; by establishing certain sanitary
- 4 regulations in the establishments in which they work; by
- 5 requiring certain abstracts and notices to be posted; by
- 6 providing for the enforcement of this act by the Commissioner of
- 7 Labor and Industry and others; by prescribing penalties for
- 8 violations thereof; by defining the procedure in prosecutions;
- 9 and by repealing all acts and parts of acts inconsistent with
- 10 the provisions thereof," as amended.
- 11 (b) If a school in any district due to crowded conditions is
- 12 unable to provide for the full time attendance of all pupils
- 13 during the school day, the board of school directors, with the
- 14 approval of the [Department of Public Instruction] department
- 15 first obtained, may provide for two half-day sessions. The
- 16 approval of the [Department of Public Instruction] <u>department</u>
- 17 shall not exceed a period of one year. Annual extensions may be
- 18 granted by the [Department] department upon review of the
- 19 circumstances of each case. Each half-day session shall be four
- 20 (4) hours in duration: Provided, That the [Superintendent of
- 21 Public Instruction] secretary may reduce the half-day session in
- 22 the first and second grades, at the request of a school
- 23 district, for cogent reasons relating to the health, safety or
- 24 welfare of the children, if, in [his] the secretary's opinion,
- 25 the school program submitted by the district shows that the
- 26 local program is adequate for these grades. Half-day sessions
- 27 shall be regarded as two regular sessions. Teachers employed for
- 28 one half-day session shall not be employed for the other on the
- 29 same day for the entire half-session, but may be required by the
- 30 school district to serve every school day for the same number of

- 1 hours prescribed by the board of school directors for regular
- 2 full-time teachers who teach full day sessions in the same
- 3 grades in the school district. Upon any violation or failure to
- 4 comply with the provisions of this subsection, the
- 5 [Superintendent of Public Instruction] secretary, on hearing,
- 6 after two (2) weeks' written notice to the board of school
- 7 directors, shall withhold and declare forfeited the State
- 8 appropriation for reimbursement on account of the instruction of
- 9 the pupils in average daily membership in the sessions in which
- 10 the requirements are not met.
- 11 (c) The board of school directors may fix the date of the
- 12 school commencement and shall pay such expenses in connection
- 13 therewith as it may determine.
- 14 (d) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 15 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless
- 16 the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 17 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 18 Commonwealth.
- 19 "Public school entity." A school district, intermediate
- 20 unit, area career and technical school, charter school, regional
- 21 charter school or cyber charter school operating within this
- 22 Commonwealth.
- 23 <u>"Secondary school." A building within a public school entity</u>
- 24 that provides instruction in grades seven through twelve or any
- 25 combination of those grades.
- 26 "Secretary." The Secretary of Education of the Commonwealth.
- 27 Section 2. Any contractually agreed-upon school daily
- 28 schedule in effect on the effective date of this section between
- 29 a public school entity, as defined in section 1504 of the act,
- 30 and its professional or nonprofessional employees and that is in

- 1 conflict with the provisions of this act shall remain in effect
- 2 for the duration of the contract.
- 3 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
