A BILL

FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

- 1 "An Act establishing a violation for hindering the Alaska Sunset Commission; relating
- 2 to the duties of the legislature; establishing the Alaska Sunset Commission to review and
- 3 make recommendations on discontinuation of or changes to state entities; and relating to
- 4 the powers and duties of the Alaska Sunset Commission."
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:
- 6 * **Section 1.** AS 11.56.845 is amended to read:
- Sec. 11.56.845. Hindering the Legislative Budget and Audit Committee or the Alaska Sunset Commission. (a) A person commits hindering the Legislative Budget and Audit Committee or the Alaska Sunset Commission established in AS 44.99.700 if the person intentionally (1) fails to give, or (2) directs, orders, threatens, restrains, coerces, forces, or prevents another person from giving, full cooperation to the legislative auditor [OR] the legislative fiscal analyst, or a member or employee of the Alaska Sunset Commission in assembling or furnishing

requested information to the committee, [OR] its staff, or the Alaska Sunset

1	Commission. and the person did not reasonably believe that the action or failure to act
2	was legally justified.
3	(b) Hindering the Legislative Budget and Audit Committee or the Alaska
4	Sunset Commission is a violation, punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000.

6	(b) Unless a waiver is granted by the commissioner of administration, an

24	Sec. 44.99.700. Establishment of commission; composition. (a) The Alaska
25	Sunset Commission is established in the office of the lieutenant governor.
26	(b) The commission consists of three members appointed by the governor, two
27	members appointed by the president of the senate, and two members appointed by the
28	speaker of the house of representatives. Members shall be qualified in financial
29	management, budgeting, economics, business operations, process improvement, or
30	government efficiency.
31	(c) Members appointed under (b) of this section

1	(1) serve staggered terms of five years until reappointed or replaced;
2	and
3	(2) may be reappointed.
4	(d) If a member appointed under (b) of this section no longer meets the
5	requirements under (b) of this section or if a vacancy exists among those members for
6	any reason other than the expiration of a member's term, the appointing authority
7	shall, within 30 days after the occurrence of the vacancy, make an appointment for the
8	unexpired portion of the term, effective immediately. An appointment made under this
9	subsection to fill an unexpired term must comply with the requirements under (b) of

12	members of the commission constitute a quorum. The commission may take action

14	(f) The commission may employ staff, and retain consultants as the

16	administrative expertise and expertise in financial management, business operations,
17	process improvement, and government efficiency.

23	(1) review the activities of principal departments and the University of
24	Alaska under AS 44.99.730;
25	(2) consider whether there is a public need for continuation of an entity
26	or for the performance of the functions of an entity reviewed under AS 44.99.730 and
27	make a recommendation to the legislature to continue, discontinue, restructure, or
28	transfer the duties and programs of the entity; and
29	(3) prepare a report and draft legislation required under AS 44.99.750.
30	(b) The commission may require all state officials and agencies of the state to
31	give full cooperation to the commission and its staff in assembling and furnishing the

1	information necessary to prepare a report under (a) of this section, including allowing
2	the commission to interview staff relating to work duties, processes, and products.

4	commission or designated staff may attend any meetings and proceedings of any entity
5	of the state, including any meeting or proceeding of a governing body of a state entity
6	that is closed to the public, and may inspect the records, documents, and files of any
7	entity of the state, including any record, document, or file that is
8	(1) attorney work product;

12	September 1 of the calendar year before the year in which an entity of the state subject
13	to AS 44.99.700 - 44.99.759 is scheduled for review under AS 44.99.730, the state
14	entity shall report to the commission
15	(1) the extent to which the entity has met the criteria in AS 44.99.740;
16	(2) a list of each report that the entity is required by law to prepare and
17	an evaluation of the need for each report based on whether factors or conditions have
18	changed since the date the requirement to prepare the report was enacted; and
19	(3) any other information that the entity considers appropriate or that is
20	requested by the commission.
21	(b) The entity shall submit the report in electronic format, as required by the
22	commission.
23	(c) A state entity that provides the commission with access to a privileged or
24	confidential communication, record, document, or file for purposes of a review under
25	AS 44.99.700 - 44.99.759 does not waive the attorney-client privilege, or any other
26	privilege or confidentiality with respect to the communication, record, document, or
27	file provided to the commission. For purposes of this subsection, a communication
28	includes a discussion that occurs at a meeting or proceeding of the state entity that is
29	closed to the public.
30	Sec. 44.99.730. Review of state entities. (a) The commission shall review at
31	least one principal department and its entities or the University of Alaska and its

1	entities each year.
2	(b) The review under (a) of this section must include a review of any public
3	corporation, board or commission, or other instrumentality of the state that is
4	established within the department or University of Alaska and a review of any
5	committee, task force, or other group that is established by law or by the department or
6	university to advise or assist the department or university.
7	Sec. 44.99.740. Criteria for review. (a) In considering whether there is a
8	public need for continuation or restructuring of an entity reviewed under AS 44.99.730
9	or for the performance of the functions of an entity reviewed under AS 44.99.730, the
10	commission shall consider the following criteria:
11	(1) the extent to which the missions established under AS 37.07.014 of
12	the entity have been carried out;
13	(2) whether the performance measurements set out in AS 37.07 are
14	appropriately set and are being met by supporting data;
15	(3) whether there is an alternative method of delivery of service to
16	better meet performance requirements;
17	(4) the extent to which the entity is organized in a manner that is
18	conducive to process improvement;
19	(5) the extent to which process improvement could benefit the entity;
20	(6) the efficiency with which the entity operates;
21	(7) if there is overlap of services with other entities, the extent to
22	which there is potential for reorganization;
23	(8) the extent to which the entity is making it difficult for persons to do
24	business with the state;
25	(9) the extent to which changes are necessary in the enabling statutes
26	of the entity so that the entity can comply with or meet the desired results established
27	by the legislature under AS 37.07.014;
28	(10) other standards established by the commission.
29	(b) By September 1 of the year of review for an entity, the commission shall
30	provide notice of and hold one or more public hearings on the interconnected state
31	road system concerning the application of the criteria listed in (a) of this section to

each entity being reviewed by the commission. At a public hearing, the commission												
shall	accept	testimony	from	the	public	and	from	a	person	involved	in	the
administration of the entity subject to the review.												

Sec. 44.99.750. Report by commission. (a) Following review of an entity under AS 44.99.730, the commission shall prepare a report on the results of the review of the entity, a summary of comments received at the public hearing on the entity, and a recommendation to the legislature to continue, discontinue, restructure, or transfer the duties and programs of an entity. The report must be based on the criteria listed in AS 44.99.740 and other factors the commission considers appropriate. The report must be delivered to the governor, the president of the senate, the speaker of the house of representatives, the chief clerk, and the senate secretary within the first 10 days of a legislative session following the calendar year of the review. A copy of the report must be delivered to every member of the legislature. The commission shall include in the report draft legislation to implement the recommendations of the commission. Draft legislation must be submitted to the rules committee of each house with a request to introduce the legislation to implement the recommendations of the commission.

- (b) If the commission recommends the discontinuation of an entity, the report must include a recommendation on the length of a winding-down period for the entity to conclude its business and proposed procedures for transferring the entity's records. If the commission recommends the restructuring of an entity, the report must include a recommended restructuring plan.
- (c) If the recommendations of the commission under (a) of this section are not implemented by law, an entity reviewed under AS 44.99.730(a) will expire on June 30 of the fiscal year following review of the entity by the commission.

Sec. 44.99.759. Definitions. In AS 44.99.700 - 44.99.759,

- (1) "commission" means the Alaska Sunset Commission;
- (2) "entity" includes a department, division, board, authority, corporation, or other unit of state government and the University of Alaska.
