FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2024 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

This bill changes the makeup of the Local Boundary Commission by changing the member from the state-at-large to a member appointed from the unorganized borough. This bill also changes the designation of chair of the commission from the member from the state-at-large to one member designated as chair by the governor. This bill adds requirements that members from each judicial district must maintain a prinicpal place of abode and be registered to vote in a precent in that district, and that the commission must maintain for each community in the state a record of that community's population according to the most recent decennial census conducted by thte United States Bureau of the Census.
The Division of Community and Regional Affairs does not anticipate fiscal impact from this legislation.

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
