FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2023 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

The bill would affirm that waters of the state may only be designated as Outstanding Natural Resource Waters (Tier 3) in statute, and that a water of the state may not be managed as an Outstanding Natural Resource Waters without a statutory designation.

There is no fiscal impact associated with the legislation for the Department of Environmental Conservation.
