- 1 Urging the United States Congress to propose an amendment to the United States
- 2 Constitution providing that the Supreme Court of the United States may be composed of
- 3 not more than nine justices.

4 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

- 5 WHEREAS an independent United States Supreme Court is an essential element of
- 6 the checks and balances designed to protect the constitutional rights of every Alaskan; and
- WHEREAS the United States Supreme Court has been composed of nine justices for
- 8 more than 150 years; and
- 9 WHEREAS the President of the United States and the United States Congress should
- 10 not possess the ability to undermine the independence of the United States Supreme Court by
- increasing the number of justices serving on the Supreme Court;
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature urges the United States
- 13 Congress to propose an amendment to the United States Constitution providing that the
- 14 Supreme Court of the United States shall be composed of not more than nine Justices.
