A BILL

FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

- 1 "An Act relating to wearing or carrying tribal regalia and objects of cultural
- 2 significance at public events; and providing for an effective date."

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

- * **Section 1.** AS 18.80 is amended by adding a new section to read:
- Sec. 18.80.257. Tribal regalia at public events. (a) A state agency, a municipality, the University of Alaska, or a school district may not prohibit an individual from wearing tribal regalia or wearing or carrying objects of traditional cultural significance at a public event.
- 9 (b) In this section,
- 10 (1) "public event" includes an award ceremony, a graduation ceremony, a public meeting, or another event held or sponsored by a state agency, a
- municipality, the University of Alaska, or a school district;
- 13 (2) "state agency" has the meaning given in AS 40.21.150;
- 14 (3) "tribal regalia" means clothing, accessories, and objects of cultural

- significance worn or carried during traditional tribal ceremonies, celebrations, or gatherings.
- * Sec. 2. The uncodified law of the State of Alaska is amended by adding a new section to read:
- NOTIFICATION. The Department of Administration shall send either a written or electronic copy of this Act to each federally recognized tribe in the state.
- 7 * Sec. 3. This Act takes effect immediately under AS 01.10.070(c).
