A RESOLUTION

1 Proclaiming September 9, 2010, as Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders Awareness Day.

2 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

- WHEREAS fetal alcohol spectrum disorders are a leading cause of preventable and permanent birth defects and mental retardation in the United States; and
- 5 WHEREAS the birth defects associated with fetal alcohol spectrum disorders include
- 6 brain damage, facial deformities, and deficits in growth, learning, memory, and internal organ
- 7 development; and
- 8 WHEREAS fetal alcohol spectrum disorders result from ingestion of alcohol by a
- 9 woman during pregnancy; and
- 10 **WHEREAS** Alaska has the highest known incidence of fetal alcohol spectrum
- disorders in the United States; and
- 12 WHEREAS fetal alcohol spectrum disorders affect all racial and socioeconomic
- 13 groups; and
- 14 **WHEREAS**, in addition to the personal emotional costs, fetal alcohol spectrum
- disorders cost taxpayers millions of dollars over an affected individual's lifetime;
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature proclaims September 9, 2010,

1 as Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders Awareness Day; and be it
