A RESOLUTION

1 Designating June 2012 as Congenital Cytomegalovirus Awareness Month.

2 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

- WHEREAS congenital cytomegalovirus is the most common congenital infection in the United States; and
- 5 **WHEREAS** one child in 150 children is born with congenital cytomegalovirus; and
- 6 **WHEREAS** contraction of congenital cytomegalovirus at birth can lead to permanent
- 7 health conditions, including hearing and vision loss, mental disability, seizures, and, in rare
- 8 cases, death; and
- 9 **WHEREAS** congenital cytomegalovirus is most dangerous for unborn babies whose
- mothers become infected with the disease during pregnancy and children or adults whose
- immune systems have been weakened by disease or drug treatment; and
- 12 **WHEREAS**, because pregnant women are the number one population at risk, the
- 13 American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists and the Centers for Disease Control
- and Prevention recommend that obstetricians and gynecologists counsel women on basic
- prevention measures to guard against congenital cytomegalovirus infection; and
- WHEREAS congenital cytomegalovirus is preventable with behavioral interventions,

- such as frequent hand washing with soap and water after contact with diapers or oral secretions, not kissing young children on the mouth, and not sharing food, towels, or utensils
- 3 with young children; and
- WHEREAS congenital cytomegalovirus is transmitted through bodily fluids, including urine, saliva, blood, mucus, and tears; and
- WHEREAS the incidence of children born with congenital cytomegalovirus can be greatly reduced with public education and awareness;
- 8 **BE IT RESOLVED** that the Alaska State Legislature designates June 2012 as 9 Congenital Cytomegalovirus Awareness Month.
