A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the North Pacific Fishery Management Council to amend the groundfish
- 2 fisheries management plan for the Gulf of Alaska to allow for an annually adjusted cap
- 3 of prohibited species catch based on an abundance of bycatch species, and expeditiously
- 4 to implement a Chinook bycatch cap to limit the number of Chinook salmon harvested
- 5 as bycatch in the Gulf of Alaska.

6 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE:

- 7 **WHEREAS** the North Pacific Fishery Management Council is the federal regulatory
- 8 body with oversight of fisheries in federal waters; and
- 9 **WHEREAS** the North Pacific Fishery Management Council currently sets a fixed cap
- of 2,000 metric tons of halibut bycatch for a trawl fishery and 300 metric tons for a longline
- fishery, regardless of bycatch species abundance; and
- WHEREAS the current groundfish fishery management plan for the Gulf of Alaska
- does not limit the number of Chinook salmon that can be taken as bycatch; and
- 14 WHEREAS the North Pacific Fishery Management Council has not revised the
- 15 groundfish fisheries management prohibited species catch plan for nearly two decades; and

1	WHEREAS Guil of Alaska namout populations have been steadily decreasing over
2	the past decade; and
3	WHEREAS the total allowable catch for commercial and sport halibut fishermen has
4	been adjusted to correspond with the decrease in halibut populations; and
5	WHEREAS the percentage of prohibited species caught has dramatically increased
6	relative to the total allowable catch for targeted halibut sport and commercial fisheries; and
7	WHEREAS the 2007 and 2010 Chinook salmon incidental catch rate in the Gulf of
8	Alaska reached historical highs of 40,320 and 51,258, respectively;
9	BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate urges the North Pacific Fishery Management
10	Council expeditiously to amend the Gulf of Alaska groundfish fisheries management plans to
11	allow for prohibited species catch limits based on the abundance of those species; and be it
12	FURTHER RESOLVED that the Senate urges the North Pacific Fishery
13	Management Council expeditiously to implement a Chinook bycatch cap to limit the number
14	of Chinook salmon harvested as bycatch in the Gulf of Alaska; and be it
15	FURTHER RESOLVED that the Senate requests the Governor to encourage his
16	appointees to the North Pacific Fishery Management Council to ensure that these matters are
17	addressed by the council with the utmost expeditiousness.

24	Honorable Don Young U.S. Representative members of the Alaska delegation in Congress
