Relating to vaccines; to require employers or contractors to allow individuals to claim an exemption from the COVID-19 vaccination for medical reasons or a sincerely held religious belief; to provide for submission of a form requesting the exemption; to authorize claims with the Department of Labor by employers or contractors before terminating an individual on the basis of refusing a vaccine; and to provide an appeal of determinations by the department.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

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Section 1. (a) For purposes of this section, the term "vaccination" includes any injection intended to prevent the spread of COVID-19 or minimize the effects of COVID-19, irrespective of whether or not the injection meets the classical definition of vaccine.

- (b) (1) Any employer or contractor that requires an individual to receive a vaccination as a condition of employment shall provide the individual the opportunity to be exempted from the vaccination mandate by submitting to the employer or contractor the form described in subsection (c). The employer or contractor shall make this form readily available to all individuals to whom this section applies, along with direction for submitting the form for processing.
- (2) An employer or contractor shall exempt from vaccination as a condition of employment any individual who has properly completed and submitted the exemption form.
 - (c) The exemption form shall read as follows:

"Any individual in the State of Alabama who is 1 2 subject to a requirement that he or she receive one or more COVID-19 vaccinations as a condition of employment may claim 3 an exemption for medical reasons or because the vaccination 4 5 conflicts with sincerely held religious beliefs. You may request either a medical or a religious 6 7 exemption from the COVID-19 vaccination by completing this form and submitting the form to your employer. 8 9 I am requesting exemption from the COVID-19 10 vaccine requirements for medical reasons. I am requesting exemption from the COVID-19 11 vaccine requirements for sincerely held religious beliefs. 12 13 14 Printed Name 15

- (d)(1) Except as provided in subdivision (2), an individual may not be terminated on the basis of refusing to receive a vaccination if he or she properly submits a completed exemption form.
- (2) In order to terminate an individual who has properly submitted a completed form, an employer must file a claim with the Department of Labor and receive a ruling from an examiner, as provided in subdivision (3), that the individual is not entitled to a medical or religious exemption under this section.

- (3) A determination upon a claim filed by an
 employer or contractor pursuant to this section shall be made
 promptly by an examiner designated by the Secretary of Labor.

 The determination shall include a statement as to whether the
 claimant is entitled to retain his or her employment.
 - (e) A decision of the examiner under subsection (d) may be appealed to a circuit court of competent jurisdiction.
 - (f) The protections provided by this section are to be liberally construed in favor of the employee.

Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
