10 TO BE ENTITLED

13 Relating to Houston County; to provide for an
14 additional expense allowance and salary for the revenue
15 commissioner; and to repeal Section 45-35-240, relating to the
16 salary of the revenue commissioner.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

18 Section 1. This act shall apply only to Houston
19 County.

20 Section 2. (a) Commencing the first day of the month
21 following the effective date of this act, the Revenue
22 Commissioner of Houston County shall receive an annual expense
23 allowance of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) payable in
24 equal monthly installments. This expense allowance shall be in
25 addition to all other compensation or benefits granted to the
26 revenue commissioner, including, the compensation provided in
27 Section 45-35-241, Code of Alabama 1975.

1 (b) Effective beginning the next term of office, the
2 annual salary of the Revenue Commissioner of Houston County
3 shall be ninety-two thousand thirty-five dollars and
4 twenty-seven cents (\$92,035.27), which shall be paid in the
5 same manner as the salary of other elected county officials,
6 and the expense allowance provided for in subsection (a) shall
7 be null and void. Excluding reimbursement for allowable
8 expenses, this salary shall be the total compensation paid to
9 the revenue commissioner.

10 (c) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, in
11 addition to any other compensation provided to the revenue
12 commissioner, the revenue commissioner shall continue to
13 receive any cost-of-living or other salary increases granted
14 by the county commission to other elected officials in the
15 county.

16 Section 3. Section 45-35-241, Code of Alabama 1975,
17 relating to the salary of the revenue commissioner, is
18 repealed.

19 Section 4. This act shall become effective
20 immediately following its passage and approval by the
21 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
