24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
25	Section 1. (a) A person who, in good faith, and not
26	for compensation, provides an individual transportation to a
27	health care facility or health care provider is not subject to

civil liability for negligence if the provider could not have reasonably anticipated the particular harm caused by the negligent act while acting in the line and scope of a volunteer in providing transportation, or the act or omission was the result of the provider's willful or wanton misconduct. The immunity provided in this subsection includes transportation from an individual's residence.

8 (b) Acceptance by the transportation provider of a 9 gratuitous contribution or donation made by the individual 10 receiving transportation services does not constitute a waiver 11 of immunity under this section.

12 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 13 first day of the third month following its passage and 14 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
