30	Section 1. Section 13A-10-41, Code of Alabama 1975, is
31	amended to read as follows:

33	(a) $\underline{\text{(1)}}$ A person commits the crime of resisting arrest
34	if he or she intentionally prevents or attempts to prevent a
35	peace officer from affecting effecting a lawful arrest of
36	himself, herself, or of another person individual.
37	$\frac{\text{(b)}}{\text{(2)}}$ Resisting arrest is a Class $\frac{\text{B}}{\text{A}}$ misdemeanor.
38	(b) A violation of subsection (a) is a Class C felony
39	if either of the following occur during the commission of the

41	(1) The person brandishes, as defined in Section
42	13A-11-7, a deadly weapon or dangerous instrument.
