5	Under existing law, the salary of any justice,
6	judge, or district attorney newly appointed or elected
7	is set by law.
8	This bill would make certain technical
9	amendments to the law to allow for the implementation

20	Relating to compensation for district attorneys,
21	judges, and certain local officials; to amend Sections
22	12-10B-1 and 12-10B-3, Code of Alabama 1975, to remove
23	restrictions on district attorney salary increases; and to
24	amend Section 12-17-182, Code of Alabama 1975, to provide for
25	the compensation of newly appointed district attorneys.
26	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
27	Section 1. Sections 12-10B-1 and 12-10B-3, Code of

Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:

- (a) Pursuant to Amendment 426 Section 148 of the

 Constitution of Alabama 1901 of 2022, now appearing as Section

 148 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of

 Alabama of 1901, as amended, and notwithstanding any other

 provision of law, beginning on October 1, 2021, judges and

 justices shall be compensated as follows:
 - (1) The chief justice of the supreme court's initial salary shall be one hundred seventy-six thousand dollars (\$176,000).
 - (2) An associate supreme court justice's initial salary shall be one hundred seventy-five thousand dollars (\$175,000).
- 41 (3) An appellate court judge's initial salary shall be 42 one hundred seventy-four thousand dollars (\$174,000). The 43 presiding judge of any appellate court shall receive 44 additional compensation of five hundred dollars (\$500) per 45 year.
 - (4) A circuit judge's initial salary shall be one hundred forty thousand dollars (\$140,000).
 - (5) A district judge's initial salary shall be one hundred thirty-nine thousand dollars (\$139,000).
- 50 (b) Each of these amounts shall be adjusted by the
 51 Administrative Office of Courts to reflect any cost-of-living
 52 adjustment effective on or after October 1, 2021.
 - (b) (1) a. (c) (1) a. The salary of circuit judges and district judges shall be increased by 7.5 percent on October 1 after the completion of six full years of service as a circuit or district judge. The salary shall be increased by an

A chief justice of the supreme court, a supreme court justice, or a judge of the appellate court who is subsequently appointed or elected as a chief justice of the supreme court, a supreme court justice, or a judge of an appellate court shall receive as an initial salary the base salary of the judge or justice as provided in subdivision subdivisions (a) (1), (a) (2), or (a) (3) of subsection (a), plus the appropriate amount for bench experience as the chief justice of the supreme court, a supreme court justice, or a judge of the appellate court as provided in paragraph a.
- (3) The compensation paid by the state to any judge or justice in service on October 1, 2021, may not be diminished pursuant to this section. If a judge's or justice's compensation would be diminished pursuant to subsection (a), his or her compensation received on October 1, 2021, shall remain the same as it was prior to October 1, 2021, and may not be increased until the bench experience increase provided for in subsection (b) exceeds his or her current compensation.

(c) (1) (d) (1) Notwithstanding any existing general or local law, existing circuit or district judges in service on October 1, 2021, and any circuit or district judge appointed or elected after October 1, 2021, may only be paid compensation from the State Treasury, and may not receive any salary supplement or expense allowance, or both, from any county.

(2) This subsection shall supersede any local law

116	(a) Beginning on October 1, 2021, and notwithstanding
117	any other provision of law, any compensation, salary
118	supplement, or expense allowance under existing law paid by
119	the state, or any political subdivision of the state, to any
120	elected official or state officer or employee, excluding
121	circuit and district judges, district attorneys, and the
122	Attorney General, that is based in whole or in part on the
123	compensation, salary supplement, or expense allowance of
124	another judge or justice shall be based on the salary, salary
125	supplement, or expense allowance of the judge or justice on
126	September 30, 2021.
127	(b) Beginning with the next term of office following
128	October 1, 2025, the compensation of any elected official
129	subject to a local law that sets his or her compensation in
130	whole or in part on the salary of a circuit or district judge
131	shall be calculated using the base amounts in Section
132	12-10B-1, and any adjustment based on service or longevity
133	must be based on the elected official's own time in office.

HB353 INTRODUCED

(a) (1) Subject to subdivision (2), district District
attorneys for each judicial circuit in the state serving on
October 1, 2021, until the end of his or her service, shall be
paid by the state an annual salary of an amount equal to one
thousand dollars (\$1,000) less than the salary paid by the
state to the highest paid circuit judge of the state, payable
as the salaries of other state officers are paid. District
attorneys holding office on October 1, 2021, are exempt from
subsection (b).

- (2) A district attorney's salary may only increase after the completion of the term for which he or she was appointed or elected, and after completion of any subsequent elected term.
- (b) (1) Notwithstanding subsection (a), any district attorney newly appointed or elected after October 1, 2021, shall receive an initial salary of one hundred forty thousand dollars (\$140,000) the salary equivalent to an incoming circuit court judge as determined by the Alabama Administrative Office of Courts.
- (2) The salary of district attorneys shall be increased by 7.5 percent for the term commencing after the completion of the first term for which he or she was appointed or elected as district attorney. The salary shall be increased by an additional 7.5 percent for the term commencing after the completion of his or her second term as district attorney. The salary shall be increased by an additional 7.5 percent for the term commencing after the completion of his or her third term as district attorney. The salary shall further be increased by



109	any cost-of-fiving adjustment enacted by the Legislature not
170	already granted to the district attorney during the previous
171	term.
172	(c) The compensation paid by the state to any district
173	attorney in service on October 1, $\frac{2021}{2025}$ may not be
174	diminished pursuant to Act 2021-441 the act adding this
175	amendatory language.
176	(d) Upon ratification of the constitutional amendment
177	proposed in Senate Bill of the 2025 Regular Session,
178	providing that the salary of a district attorney may not be
179	decreased during his or her term of office, the salary of each
180	district attorney shall be increased by any cost-of-living
181	adjustment effective on or after October 1, 2021, that is not
182	already reflected in his or her compensation."
183	Section 3. This act shall become effective on October
184	1, 2025.
