- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

- Section 1. This act may be cited as the Broadcasters

 Emergency Response Authorization Act.
- Section 2. For purposes of this act, the following words have the following meanings:
 - (1) BROADCASTER. A radio broadcasting station, cable operator, or television broadcasting station primarily engaged in, and deriving income from, the business of facilitating speech via over-the-air and cable communications, both as to pure speech and commercial speech.
 - (2) EMERGENCY. A state of emergency declared by the Governor pursuant to Section 31-9-8, Code of Alabama 1975.
 - engineer or other technical person certified as an emergency response engineer pursuant to this act who is used exclusively for the purpose of restoring, repairing, or resupplying a facility or equipment critical to the ability of a broadcaster to acquire, produce, and transmit essential emergency public information programming, including, without limitation, repairing and maintaining transmitters and generators and transporting fuel for generators.

Section 3. Broadcasters in this state, in cooperation with the Alabama Emergency Management Agency, the Alabama Association of Emergency Managers, and the Alabama

Broadcasters Association, or their successor organizations,
may develop comprehensive, coordinated plans for granting
credentials to emergency response engineers as authorized
herein.

Section 4. The plans developed as provided in Section 3 may include a program for training and certifying broadcast engineers and technical personnel as emergency response engineers. Each program established pursuant to this subsection shall meet all of the following criteria:

- (1) Be consistent with federal law and guidelines.
- (2) Provide training and education, as determined by the Alabama Emergency Management Agency, concerning restoring, repairing, and resupplying any facilities and equipment of a broadcaster in an area affected by an emergency.
- (3) Provide training and education concerning the personal safety of an emergency response engineer in an area affected by an emergency.
- (b) To the extent practicable and consistent with not endangering public safety or inhibiting recovery efforts, state and local governmental agencies shall allow properly credentialed emergency response engineers temporary access to an area affected by an emergency for the exclusive purpose of restoring, repairing, or resupplying any facility or equipment critical to the ability of a broadcaster to acquire, produce, and transmit essential emergency public information programming, including, without limitation, repairing and maintaining transmitters and generators and transporting fuel

1 for generators. In addition, when a radio broadcasting 2 station, television broadcasting station, or cable operator is located in an area affected by an emergency, state and local 3 governmental agencies shall allow other essential personnel access to production facilities for the purpose of producing 5 6 and presenting emergency public information programming. 7 Neither the State of Alabama nor any local government or any employee thereof shall be liable for any action or inaction of 8 the credentialed emergency response broadcaster or any other 9 10 essential personnel granted access pursuant to this section. 11 Section 5. This act shall become effective 12 immediately following its passage and approval by the 13 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
