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8	SYNOPSIS:	Under existing law, a child who is six years
9		of age on or before December 31 is entitled to
10		admission to the first grade in the public
11		elementary schools, and a child that is five years
12		of age on or before September 1 is entitled to
13		admission to the local public school kindergartens.
14		This bill would require that a child
15		successfully complete public or nonpublic
16		kindergarten before being admitted to the first
17		grade in the public elementary schools of the
18		state.
19		This bill would also change the date for
20		determining the age of a child entitled to
21		admission to public school kindergarten from
22		September 1 to December 31.
23		Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama
24		of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the
25		Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
26		Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general
27		law whose purpose or effect would be to require a

new or increased expenditure of local funds from becoming effective with regard to a local governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote unless: it comes within one of a number of specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

19 AN ACT

To amend Section 16-28-4, Code of Alabama 1975, relating to the minimum age for attendance at public schools; to require a child to successfully complete a kindergarten program before being admitted to first grade; to change the date for determining the age of a child entitled to admission to public school kindergarten from September 1 to December 31; and in connection therewith would have as its purpose or

1 effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of

2 local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 of the

3 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section

111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of

Alabama of 1901, as amended.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

7 Section 1. Section 16-28-4 of the Code of Alabama

1975, is amended to read as follows:

9 "\$16-28-4.

"(a) (1) A child who is six years of age on or before December 31 or the date on which school begins in the enrolling district, and who has successfully completed public or nonpublic kindergarten, shall be entitled to admission to the first grade in the public elementary schools at the opening of such schools for that school year, or as soon as practicable thereafter. Successful completion of public or nonpublic kindergarten shall also be required before admission to the first grade under subdivisions (2) and (3) or any other provision of law.

"(2) A child who is under six years of age on December 31 or the date on which school begins in the enrolling district shall not be entitled to admission to the first grade in the public elementary schools during that school year; except, that an underage child who transfers from the first grade of a school in another state may be admitted to school upon approval of the <u>local</u> board of education in authority, and an underage child who has moved into this state

having completed or graduated from a mandated kindergarten program in another state shall be entitled to admission to the public elementary schools regardless of age.

"(3) A child who becomes six years of age on or before February 1 may, on approval of the local board of education, may be admitted at the beginning of the second semester of that school year to schools in school systems having semiannual promotions of pupils.

"(b) (1) A child who is five years of age on or before September 1 or the date on which school begins in the enrolling district December 31, shall be entitled to admission to the local public school kindergartens at the opening of such schools for that school year or as soon as practicable thereafter; a.

"(2) A child who is under five years of age on September 1 or the date on which school begins in the enrolling district December 31, shall not be entitled to admission to such schools during that school year; except that, an underage child who transfers from the public school kindergarten in another state may be admitted to local public kindergarten on the prior approval of the local board of education on a space available basis. The aforementioned underage Underage children transferring from the public school kindergartens of another state, upon successful completion of the kindergarten in the local public or nonpublic schools, will shall then be allowed admission to the first grade of the local public schools.

1	"(c) No public school system shall lose any teacher
2	unit as a result of this section. The State Board of Education
3	is authorized to shall adopt policies for local boards of
4	education for the implementation of this section."
5	Section 2. This act shall become effective
6	immediately following its passage and approval by the
7	Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
