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8 SYNOPSIS: Existing law does not prohibit a person who
9 is convicted of an election offense from serving as
10 an employee or officer or a volunteer at any voter
11 center, voting place, precinct, on a canvassing
12 board, on an election commission, or on a board of
13 registrars.

14 This bill would provide that a person who is
15 convicted of a felony election offense may not
16 serve as an employee or officer or a volunteer at
17 any voter center, voting place, precinct, on a
18 canvassing board, on an election commission, or on
19 a board of registrars.

25 Relating to elections; to prohibit a person who is
26 convicted of a felony election offense from serving as an
27 employee or officer or a volunteer at any voter center, voting

1 place, precinct, on a canvassing board, on an election
2 commission, or on a board of registrars.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

4 Section 1. A person who has been convicted of
5 violating any felony provision of Chapter 17, Title 17, Code
6 of Alabama 1975, may not serve as an employee, officer or a
7 volunteer at any voter center, voting place, precinct, on a
8 canvassing board, on an election commission, or on a board of
9 registrars or in any other capacity as an election officer or
10 overseer of any election.

11 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
12 first day of the third month following its passage and
13 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
