19	manufacturing line, before accepting a job at a cotton mill in
20	Columbus, Georgia; during World War II, she enlisted in the
21	WACS, where she received training for weather service and
22	served at the Pentagon; and
23	WHEREAS, Mrs. Dixon earned her high school diploma
24	and studied at Andalusia Business School; she rejoined Alatex
25	as a payroll clerk remained in employment with Alatex for 32
26	years; in 1976, she married Solon Dixon; she worked with her

husband to materialize his dream of preserving forest lands and the Dixon homeplace, homesteaded between 1815 and 1830;

WHEREAS, on December 15, 1978, the Dixons presented Auburn University with a deed for 80 acres and a check for \$500,000 to begin the construction of the Solon Dixon Forestry Education Center; the Solon and Martha Dixon Foundation was established in 1981 with a focus on forestry and forestry education projects; Martha has been instrumental in ensuring that Solon's wishes for the foundation have been carried out; and

WHEREAS, in 1998, Mrs. Dixon donated her 6,000 square foot home to the Andalusia Area Chamber of Commerce; in 2006, she was recognized for having given more than \$1 million to the Covington County School System; she has also contributed generously to the Andalusia and Opp City School Systems; Mrs. Dixon served as an organizer and director of SouthTrust Bank of Andalusia and as a board member of LBW Community College Foundation; she is a lifetime member of the Lyman Ward Military Academy Alumni Association; her husband was an alum of Lyman Ward, and the Dixons have greatly contributed to the school; she has the utmost distinctions of being the recipient of the Distinguished Service Award and President's Award from the Andalusia Area Chamber of Commerce, of being selected Kiwanis Citizen of the Year, and of being a director emerita of the Solon and Martha Dixon Foundation; and
