he shares any partnership ventures, equity interest, joint

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Federation and Russian citizens, including debts owed; whether

ventures, or licensing agreements with Russia or Russian
 entities; and

3 WHEREAS, President Trump's close advisors, including 4 Carter Page, Paul Manafort, Roger Stone, and General Michael 5 Flynn have been under investigation for their ties to the 6 Russian Federation;

7 WHEREAS, a Russian Deputy Foreign Minister told 8 Interfax, a Russian Media Outlet, on September 10, "There were 9 contacts" with Donald Trump's 2016 campaign; this has been 10 corroborated by American news reports that members of 11 President Trump's inner circle were in contact with senior 12 Russian officials throughout the 2016 campaign; and

13 WHEREAS, if there was indeed no undue influence on 14 President Trump or his 2016 presidential campaign, the release 15 of tax returns could afford the President an opportunity to 16 prove his innocence; and

WHEREAS, the Emoluments Clause was included in the
United States Constitution for the express purpose of
preventing federal officials from accepting any present,
emolument, or titles from any prince or foreign state; and

21 WHEREAS, according to a 2016 candidate filing with 22 the Federal Election Commission, President Trump holds 564 23 financial positions in companies located around the world; and 24 WHEREAS, against the advice of ethics attorneys and 25 the Office of Government Ethics, President Trump has refused 26 to divest ownership stakes in his businesses; President Trump 27 earned \$434 million during 2018, much of which was derived

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1 from his ownership of hotels in which foreign dignitaries and 2 business representatives conveniently prefer to lodge when 3 hoping for an audience with the President; and

WHEREAS, according to the Washington Post, the Trump International Hotel in Washington, D.C. has hired a Director of Diplomatic Sales to generate high-price business among foreign leaders and diplomatic delegations; and

8 WHEREAS, the most-signed petition on the White House 9 website calls for the release of the President's tax returns 10 and information to verify compliance with the Emoluments 11 Clause; 1,114,870 American citizens have signed that petition 12 as of this date; and

13 WHEREAS, the Chairman of the United States House of 14 Representatives Ways and Means Committee on Taxation and the 15 Senate Finance Committee had the authority to request the 16 President's tax returns under Section 6103 of the Internal 17 Revenue Service Code; the Joint Committee on Taxation reviewed 18 the tax returns of President Richard Nixon in 1974 and made 19 the information public; and

20 WHEREAS, the House Ways and Means Committee used 21 Internal Revenue Code Section 6103 authority in 2014 to make 22 public the confidential information of 51 taxpayers; and

23 WHEREAS, the New York State Assembly passed 24 legislation on May 22, 2019, to require the state's tax 25 commissioner to provide New York state tax returns to Congress 26 upon request by the House Ways and Means Committee, clearly

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1 signalling the state's agreement to release the tax returns of 2 one of its residents; and

WHEREAS, the American people have the right to know whether or not their President is operating under conflicts of interest relating to international affairs, tax returns, government contracts, or otherwise; now therefore,

7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That this body hereby respectfully 8 requests that the Office of the President of the United States 9 10 immediately release the tax return information of President Donald J. Trump for the tax years 2006-2016 for review in 11 12 closed executive session by the United States House of 13 Representatives Committee on Ways and Means as provided by 14 Section 6103 of the Internal Revenue Code.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this body requests that the Ways and Means Committee vote on releasing the information to the full House of Representatives and the American public.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this body supports transparency in government and the long-standing tradition of Presidents and presidential candidates disclosing their tax returns.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be provided to the Alabama Congressional Delegation, the United States House of Representatives Committee on Ways and Means, the Joint Tax Committee of the United States Congress, and the President of the United States, so that the sentiments of this body may be known.

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
