9 MCGILBERRY.

11 WHEREAS, it is a privilege to honor the life of
12 Alabama Department of Corrections Officer, Sergeant Randall
13 Seth McGilberry; and

14 WHEREAS, the life of Sergeant McGilberry was marked
15 by dedicated service to his country, his community, and his
16 fellowman; he was born in Omaha, Nebraska, on July 26, 1979,
17 to Randy and Roxie McGilberry and was endowed with a deep
18 sense of civic responsibility, initially manifested as he
19 served with honor and distinction from 2005-2007, in the
20 United States Army, as an escort for his returning brothers
21 who had lost their lives in battle; and

22 WHEREAS, following his military service, he was a
23 correctional officer at the Saint Clair Correctional Facility
24 in Springville, Alabama, graduating as the president of his
25 class from the Academy for Corrections Officers; continually
26 striving for excellence, he was promoted to Sergeant; at the
27 correctional facility, he was known for being able to diffuse

1 a tense situation upon entering the room with a smile and a
2 joke; he was able to take control of circumstances without
3 using strength and force; he quickly gained the respect of the
4 inmates and the officers; he will always be remembered for
5 being a giver; and

6 WHEREAS, next to his zeal for his community and his
7 fellowman, Sergeant McGilberry loved and pursued baseball; due
8 to his hard work ethic, he was able to be a part of the Auburn
9 University Baseball Southeastern Conference Championship Team,
10 attaining a beloved SEC Championship ring; and

11 WHEREAS, Sergeant McGilberry personified the finest
12 qualities of those valiant individuals who choose the
13 profession of correctional officer and devote their lives to
14 protecting others; now therefore,

15 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF
16 THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That the life of Randall Seth
17 McGilberry is honored and commemorated, and by this resolution
18 highest tribute is offered to him and to his family, on behalf
