WHEREAS, she developed a program that taught various language skills through music, Sing to Improve Reading (STIR), and was able to implement this system across the nation, ultimately recording a CD that continues to be used in classrooms; in addition, she was in demand as the accompanist for many renowned artists and contributed to acclaimed AAA productions, continuing her aid to the Theatre Department after retirement; and

WHEREAS, of special significance are Mrs. Wilson's choral arrangements that have become staples in houses of worship nationwide; her church music ministry began with the formation of a youth choir in 1975 at First Missionary Baptist Church, where she served as the pianist; the assemblage became appropriately known as "The Inspirational Choir" and has traveled throughout the United States in addition to being involved in outstanding local productions and singing with many famous artists, including being presented with a Gold Record for a Kenny Rogers album that reached 500,000 sales; and
