11 WHEREAS, highest commendations are herein proudly  
12 presented to Indian Springs Village, Alabama, on the momentous  
13 occasion of its 25th Anniversary Celebration; and

14 WHEREAS, Indian Springs Village was formed out of a  
15 need to preserve and protect the nature and character of the  
16 Indian Springs area at the base of Oak Mountain, Alabama, in  
17 1990; and

18 WHEREAS, the town's first officials elected in 1991,  
19 were mayor, Hub Harrington, and council members, Patricia  
20 Crapet, Gary Dennis, Stewart Dudley, Ronald Luster, and Dr.  
21 Peter Peacock, all of whom had supported incorporation and  
22 pledged running the town without additional taxes or changes  
23 in police, fire, and school services; and

24 WHEREAS, to date, the pledge of the first officials  
25 has been kept, and the town's operation is fueled by the  
26 efforts of volunteers; and

1           WHEREAS, residents have received a monthly  
2 newsletter, The Village Voice, since April 2, 1991; and

3           WHEREAS, the Indian Springs Village Town Hall was  
4 established December 17, 1995, in a renovated 100-year-old  
5 home formerly owned by the McClellan Family; well-attended  
6 celebrations known for fostering good will and community  
7 spirit are hosted here as well as council and club meetings;

9           WHEREAS, the Shelby County Board of Education has  
10 built four new Oak Mountain Schools, and Indian Springs  
11 Village also boasts three private schools, Indian Springs  
12 School, Joseph S. Bruno Montessori Academy, and Our Lady of  
13 the Valley Parochial School; nearby is the beautiful new North  
14 Shelby Library; and

15           WHEREAS, Indian Spring Village espouses Southern  
16 charm and heritage, along with an enduring legacy that  
17 reflects immense honor upon the entire State of Alabama; now  
18 therefore,

19           BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF  
20 THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That Indian Springs Village is  
21 highly honored and commended, and this resolution is offered  
22 to the venerable town in deepest admiration and appreciation,
