WHEREAS, an expert, unbiased evaluation and analysis of the existing prison population, prison facilities, and other associated policies and practices of the Department of Corrections would significantly assist the department in implementing effective reforms, thus improving department management, operations, and programming and refining the overall design, delivery, management, and evaluation of corrections services; and

WHEREAS, an evaluation and analysis of the corrections program by NIC would also aid the Legislature in the introduction and adoption of meaningful legislation crafted to improve or eliminate any identified deficits in the delivery of corrections services in this state; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF
THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That by this resolution, Kay Ivey,
Governor of Alabama, is respectfully urged to request an
evaluation and analysis of the existing corrections program
from the National Institute of Corrections to identify
potential reforms to address the following:

(1) Prison overcrowding. 1 2 (2) Outdated and insufficient prison facilities. 3 (3) Violence in prisons. (4) Criminal activity within prisons, including use 4 5 of local resources for investigations. (5) Victimization of citizens through extortion 6 7 relating to inmates in state prisons. (6) Mental health, health care, substance abuse and 8 9 addiction, and education services for inmates. 10 (7) Staffing and employee recruiting issues. (8) Hiring practices and qualifications for 11 12 management staff. 13 (9) Any other deficit in the delivery of corrections services in this state. 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this 16 resolution be provided to Governor Ivey so that the sentiments

of this body may be known.
