11 that we mourn the death of Mrs. Lorene Camp Scott of Cullman,
12 Alabama, on May 14, 2013, at the age of 90 years; and

13 WHEREAS, her passing leaves a void in the lives of
14 her loving family and her many friends; and

15 WHEREAS, born on January 14, 1923, she was one of
16 nine children of Carl and Georgia Camp; and

17 WHEREAS, she was well-known in the community for her
18 hard work, generosity, love of life, and devotion to God,
19 family, and friends; her charity work began more than six
20 decades ago when she helped charter the VFW Auxiliary; and

21 WHEREAS, Mrs. Scott was one of the first members of
22 St. Andrew's United Methodist Church, where she continued to
23 serve faithfully; the civic organizations and worthy causes in
24 which she played key roles are innumerable, and among those
25 nearest and dearest to her heart were Christmas Love, which
26 she founded in 1988, and the Pilot Club and Pilot Light Home
27 for abused and neglected children; and

1 WHEREAS, on May 7, 2005, she was honored with a
2 celebration of her life at Cullman Medical Center on what was
3 officially designated as Lorene Scott Day; and

4 WHEREAS, in addition to her parents, she was
5 predeceased by her husband of 53 years, James C. Scott;
6 son-in-law, Larry Joe Wright; and brothers, S.C. Camp, Jr.,
7 Fred Camp, and Clifford Camp; and

8 WHEREAS, survivors include her daughter, Renee
9 Wright; grandsons, Larry Joe Wright, Jr., and Steven
10 (Stephanie) Wright; great-grandsons, Joseph, James, and Jacob
11 Wright; sisters, Mildred Lamberth, Theolone Hill, Jean
12 Roberson, and Margaret Hamrick; brother, James (Mary) Camp;
13 sister-in-law, Estelle Camp; and numerous nieces and nephews;

15 WHEREAS, Mrs. Scott was a valued member of the
16 community, and few individuals have equaled the extent of her
17 contributions to children; although her presence will be
18 greatly missed, her legacy will endure and her memory will be
