12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
13	Section 1. Section 34-23-50, Code of Alabama 1975,
14	is amended to read as follows:
15	" §34-23-50.
16	"(a) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or
17	corporation to practice pharmacy in this state or to permit
18	prescriptions to be compounded $\frac{\text{and}}{\text{or}}$ or dispensed by $\frac{\text{persons}}{\text{or}}$
19	a person other than those a person duly licensed by the board
20	to practice pharmacy in this state; provided, that any.
21	"(b)(1) Notwithstanding subsection (a), the board
22	may issue a pharmacy intern/extern permit as further provided
23	in this subsection that authorizes a pharmacy intern or extern
24	to compound and dispense prescriptions while serving under the

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"(2) The following persons may apply to the board for a pharmacy intern/extern permit:

"a. A person who holds a professional degree in pharmacy from a school of pharmacy recognized by the board who is serving his or her internship under the immediate direct supervision of a pharmacist on the premises registered by the board and any desires to serve as a pharmacy intern.

"b. A person who is enrolled in a school of pharmacy recognized by the board working under the immediate and direct supervision of a pharmacist on the premises registered by the board pursuing his or her education as a pharmacist shall be permitted to compound and/or dispense prescriptions who desires to serve as a pharmacy extern while pursuing his or her education as a pharmacist. In order to be considered enrolled in a school of pharmacy and pursuing his or her education as a pharmacist, $\frac{1}{2}$ the person shall not be absent from the school of pharmacy for more than two consecutive semesters or three consecutive quarters, dependent upon the system in use in the school of pharmacy. Any bona fide resident of this state who shall furnish proof to the board in person by affidavits from two pharmacists licensed by the State Board of Pharmacy, neither of whom shall be related to the applicant by blood or marriage, within a period of 90 days

subsequent to August 26, 1966, establishing the fact that he
or she has filled prescriptions under the supervision of a
licensed pharmacist over a period of at least 15 successive
years next preceding the offer of such proof shall be issued
an assistant's certificate which will authorize the person to
practice pharmacy in this state; provided, that the person
shall be under the supervision of a licensed pharmacist at all
times, and such person shall be subject to all of the
provisions of this chapter governing the practice of pharmacy
in this state, including, but not limited to, the revocation
or suspension of such certificate for violations of the
provisions of this chapter; and provided further, that such
person shall pay an original registration fee to be determined
by the board, but the fee shall not be less than twenty-five
dollars (\$25) nor more than fifty dollars (\$50) upon the
issuance of such certificate. All certificates so issued shall
expire on December 31 of even-numbered years. In order to
continue to obtain a certificate as a pharmacist's assistant,
a biennial renewal fee in an amount determined by the board
shall be paid, but the fee shall not be less than twenty-five
dollars (\$25) nor more than one hundred fifty dollars (\$150).
This renewal fee shall be paid to the secretary of the board
and shall be due on October 31 and delinquent after December
31 of even-numbered years. The payment of the renewal fee
shall entitle the holder thereof to renewal of his or her

certifi	cate at the discretion of the board. If any
pharmac:	ist's assistant fails to pay a renewal fee on or befor
the due	date, the holder of the certificate may be reinstated
as a pha	armacist's assistant only upon payment of a penalty of
ten dol:	lars (\$10) for each lapsed month and all lapsed fees,
provide	d the lapsed time of certification shall not exceed
five yea	ars, in which case reinstatement may be had only upon
satisfa	ctory examination by the board. As used in this
section	, the term "supervision" shall be construed to mean
that the	e supervising licensed pharmacist shall be either
persona :	lly present or on call and available for consultation
at all	times, or a licensed pharmacist designated by the
supervi	sing licensed pharmacist shall be either personally
present	or on call and available for consultation at all
times.	

"(3) A person requesting a pharmacy intern/extern

permit shall submit an application to the board in a form as

determined by the board. The person shall be required to be of

good moral character and a citizen of the United States or, if

not a citizen, must be legally present in the United States

with appropriate documentation from the federal government.

Further, the person shall not have engaged in any conduct that

would be a violation of this chapter or board rule.

"(4) The application shall be accompanied with an initial fee of not more than one hundred dollars (\$100).

1	"(5) The board shall require a background check on
2	each applicant as part of the initial application process. The
3	cost of the background check shall be paid by the applicant.
4	"(6) A pharmacy intern/extern permit shall expire on
5	December 31 of odd-numbered years. In order to continue to
6	work as an intern or extern, a renewal fee of not more than
7	one hundred dollars (\$100), as determined by the board, shall
8	be received by the board by December 31 of the year of
9	expiration. If the renewal is not timely received by the
10	board, the applicant for renewal shall pay a penalty of not
11	more than fifty dollars (\$50), as determined by the board, for
12	<pre>each month the renewal is late.</pre>
13	"(7) For the purposes of this subsection, "immediate
14	direct supervision" means that at least one pharmacist is
15	personally present and available on the premises of the
16	pharmacy for consultation with the intern or extern at all
17	times.
18	" (b) (c) Notwithstanding Section 20-2-51 or any other
19	law to the contrary, each person licensed by the board to
20	practice pharmacy may distribute or dispense controlled
21	substances during the biennial period for which the person is
22	licensed."
23	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
24	first day of the third month following its passage and
25	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
