15		election.
16		This bill would allow a registered voter to

Relating to voting; to amend Sections 17-3-50, 17-11-3, and 17-11-7, Code of Alabama 1975; to authorize absentee ballot voting without an excuse; to allow a person to register to vote up to and on the day of an election; to establish an early voting period for voting and provide for hours of operation and general management of the early voting period; to provide for automatic voter registration in conjunction with the issuance, updating, or renewal of driver's licenses or nondriver identification cards and to authorize rulemaking by the Secretary of State and the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency.

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2 Section 1. Sections 17-3-50, 17-11-3, and 17-11-7,

Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:

"§17-3-50.

"(a) The boards of registrars in the several counties of the state shall not register any person as a qualified elector within 14 days prior to any election; provided, that the In order to vote in any election for which registration is required, a person must be registered to vote in the jurisdiction of his or her residence before the close of the polling place on the day of the election. Any individual who chooses to register to vote on the day of an election shall be allowed to register, if eligible, at his or her polling place. The boards of registrars shall maintain open offices during business days in such the 14-day period before an election and on election day during the hours of voting. Any person registering to vote after the date of an election shall be eligible to vote in subsequent elections.

(b) The Secretary of State shall adopt rules to implement this section.

"(a) Any qualified elector of this state may apply for and vote an absentee ballot by mail or by hand delivery, as provided in Sections 17-11-5 and 17-11-9, in any primary, general, special, or municipal election, if he or she makes application in writing therefor not less than five days prior

to the election in which he or she desires to vote. and meets 1 2 one of the following requirements: "(1) The person will be out of the county or the 3 state, or the municipality for municipal elections, on election day. 5 "(2) The person has any physical illness or infirmity which prevents his or her attendance at the polls, whether he or she is within or without the county on the day of the election. 10 "(3) The person works on a shift which has at least 10 hours which coincide with the hours the polls are open at 11 12 his or her regular polling place. Alabama National Guard, the United States Naval Reserves, the

United States Air Force Reserves, and the United States Army Reserve on active duty or active duty for training or an applicant who is the spouse of any member of the armed forces or any other applicant qualified to vote absentee pursuant to the federal Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act, 42 U.S.C. 1973ff, may make application for an absentee ballot by filling out the federal postcard application form, authorized and provided for under the provisions of "The Federal Voting Assistance Act of 1955," Public Law 296, Chapter 656, H.R. 4048, approved August 9, 1955, 84th Congress 1st Session.

"(c) Any registered elector who requires emergency treatment of a licensed physician within five days of an election may apply for an emergency absentee ballot for the election and may vote by returning the absentee ballot no later than noon on the day the election is held. The attendant physician shall describe and certify the circumstances as constituting an emergency on a special form designed by the Secretary of State and provided by his or her office to local absentee election managers. The special form shall be attached to the application.

"(d) Any registered elector whose name appears on the poll list of qualified voters may vote by an emergency absentee ballot if he or she is required by his or her employer under unforeseen circumstances to be out of the county on an emergency business trip on election day. Under such circumstances, the applicant shall apply for an emergency

absentee ballot at the office of the absentee election manager no later than the close of the business day one day prior to the election. The applicant shall complete and file an application form designed by the Secretary of State for emergency absentee voters. The form shall contain an affidavit which the applicant shall sign or swear acknowledging that he or she was not aware of the out-of-county business requirement prior to five days before the election. An applicant who meets the requirements of this subsection may vote by an emergency absentee ballot. After voting the ballot, the voter shall hand the ballot to the absentee election manager.

"(e) If the occurrence of a state of emergency as declared in this or any other state, or by the federal government, renders substantial compliance with this article impossible or unreasonable for a group of qualified voters who respond to the emergency, the Secretary of State, pursuant to Section 41-22-5, may promulgate an emergency rule to allow those qualified voters to vote by absentee ballot.

Notwithstanding any other laws to the contrary, all expenses and costs incurred by the state or any county in carrying out the responsibilities and duties included in an emergency rule promulgated pursuant to this subsection shall be paid by the State of Alabama from any funds made available for election expenses under state and federal law.

"(f) Notwithstanding any other provision of otherwise applicable law, in the event more than one absentee ballot is cast in the name of the single voter, whether any

- (9) Whether the applicant affirmatively declined to become registered to vote during the transaction with the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency or other license issuing official by a signed statement that the applicant refuses to register to vote or does not meet the qualifications to register to vote.
- (10) Any other information the Secretary of State, by rule, determines to be reasonably necessary to implement this section.
- (b) Unless the applicant affirmatively declines by use of an opt-out process to become registered to vote or update his or her voter registration during the transaction with the license issuing official, the official shall release all of the information obtained pursuant to subsection (a) to the Secretary of State, as further provided in subsection (f). The Secretary of State shall forward the information to the board of registrars for the relevant county, and the board of registrars shall process the newly automatically registered

voter or update information for the elector. If the applicant affirmatively declines to become registered to vote, the license issuing official shall transmit the first name, middle name, last name, premarital name, if applicable, residence address, date of birth, and signature to the Secretary of State, along with the notation that the applicant affirmatively declined to become registered through an opt-out process when applying for, renewing, or updating a driver's license or nondriver identification card.

- (c) The license issuing official shall notify the applicant that by submitting his or her signature, the applicant grants written consent for the submission of the information obtained and required to be submitted to the Secretary of State pursuant to this section. Information regarding an applicant's failure to sign the voter registration application is confidential and may not be used for any purpose other than to determine voter registration.
- (d) An application for voter registration submitted pursuant to this section updates a previous voter registration by the applicant and authorizes the cancellation of registration in any other county or state in which the applicant was previously registered.
- (e) A change of address from one residence to another that is submitted for updating a driver's license or nondriver identification card serves as a notice of change of address for voter registration purposes.

(f) Completed applications for voter registration or change of address for voting purposes received by a license issuing official shall be forwarded to the Secretary of State within five days of receipt. The Secretary of State shall remove and file any forms that have not been signed by the applicant and shall forward completed, signed applications to the board of registrars of the appropriate county within five days of receipt.

- (g) Voter registration applications submitted to a license issuing official that are unsigned shall be collected by the official and submitted to and maintained by the Secretary of State according to the retention policy adopted by the Secretary of State, provided that the retention policy shall require the records to be retained for at least four years.
- (h) Information obtained pursuant to this section is not a public record for purposes of Chapter 13 of Title 41, Code of Alabama 1975, and the Secretary of State, by rule, shall establish procedures to protect the confidentiality of the information obtained pursuant to this section.
- (i) This section shall not be construed as requiring or authorizing the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency, judges of probate, license commissioners, or other license issuing officials to determine eligibility for voter registration or voting.
- (j) The Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency and the Secretary of State may adopt rules to implement this section.

Section 3. (a) Registered voters may vote in advance of election day, without excuse, in person or by mail for all federal or state and federal general elections as provided in this section.

- (b) Early voting shall be conducted from the sixth Tuesday before the election until the close of regular business hours on the Monday immediately before the election for both in person and mail-in voting. The hours for conducting early voting shall be weekdays 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., except for the 21 days immediately before election day, the hours for voting shall also include Saturdays and Sundays from 11:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and beginning on the Tuesday immediately before election day, the hours for conducting early voting shall be from 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- establish at least one early voting location for every three voting precincts within the county, and ensure that the locations are as centrally located as practicable. In determining where to locate the early voting locations, the judge of probate shall consider factors including, but not limited to, the geographic location and demographics of voters.
- (d) The judge of probate shall provide adequate public notice of the hours and locations for early voting at the office of the judge of probate and the office of the appropriate board of registrars, on the website for the county

and appropriate municipalities, and by any other methods deemed reasonable.

- (e) Election officials shall be appointed to serve at each early voting location in the same manner as is provided in Section 17-8-1, Code of Alabama 1975, and the casting of ballots and tabulating of ballots shall be conducted the same as provided in Chapter 9 of Title 17, Code of Alabama 1975.
 - (f) The judges of probate and Secretary of State shall make available a list of all electors who voted during the early voting period. The list shall include voter information that is a matter of public record.
 - (g) The Secretary of State may adopt rules to ensure that electors who vote during the early voting period do not vote again on election day, except by provisional ballot as otherwise provided by law.

Section 4. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
