13	citizenship qualifications for certification, and to reduce

16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
17	Section 1. Section 34-1-4, Code of Alabama 1975, is
18	amended to read as follows:
19	"§34-1-4.
20	"(a) If each of the following qualifications is met,
21	the certificate of certified public accountant shall be
22	granted by the board to any person:
23	" (1) Who is a citizen of the United States or, if
24	not a citizen of the United States, a person who is legally
25	present in the United States with appropriate documentation
26	from the federal government, or has duly declared his or her
27	intent to become a citizen.

"(2)<u>(</u>1) Who has attained the age of 19 years.

2

"(3)(2) Who is of good moral character.

3 "(4)(3) Who meets the following educational 4 requirements:

"a. A person shall have earned a college degree from 5 a four-year college or university accredited by a regional 6 7 accreditation board such as the Southern Association of Colleges and Universities, with a concentration in accounting 8 or what the board determines to be substantially the 9 equivalent of a concentration in accounting. Persons who, on 10 May 16, 1989, have previously taken the uniform written CPA 11 12 examination shall be considered to meet these qualifications.

"b. After January 1, 1995, any person who has not 13 previously sat for the uniform CPA examination shall have 14 15 completed a total of 150 semester hours or 225 quarter hours of postsecondary education, including a baccalaureate degree 16 17 at a college or university accredited by a regional accreditation board such as the Southern Association of 18 Colleges and Universities. The total education program shall 19 include an accounting concentration as defined by the board 20 21 and other course work as the board may require by regulation.

"(5)(4)a. Who has successfully passed a uniform examination, administered by the board or its designee, in accounting and auditing and in any other related subjects as the board deems necessary, including, but not limited to, business law and taxation, to maintain the highest standard of proficiency in the profession of public accounting. "b. After January 1, 1995 2016, in order to be
eligible for an initial sitting for the uniform CPA
examination, a person shall have completed a total of 150 120
semester hours or 225 180 quarter hours of education,
including a baccalaureate degree at a college or university
accredited by a regional accreditation board such as the
Southern Association of Colleges and Universities.

8 "(b)(1) Examinations provided for in this chapter 9 shall be given by the board as often as necessary, but not 10 less frequently than twice each year. The board shall, after 11 each examination, notify applicants of the results.

12 "(2) The board may issue certificates under the 13 signature and the official seal of the board, pursuant to this 14 chapter.

"(c) The board shall charge each person certified 15 under subsection (e) and each candidate an application fee for 16 the uniform CPA examination in an amount determined by the 17 board. Examination and reexamination fees shall be charged by 18 the board, or its designee, in amounts determined by the board 19 for each subject in which a candidate is examined. The 20 21 applicable fees shall be paid to the board, or its designee, 22 by the candidate at the time he or she applies for examination 23 or reexamination.

"(d) Persons who, on May 16, 1989, held certified
public accountant certificates issued under the laws of this
state shall not be required to obtain additional certificates
under this chapter, but shall otherwise be subject to this

chapter. The certificates issued shall, for all purposes, be
 considered certificates issued under this chapter and subject
 to this chapter.

4 "(e) The board may waive the examination under subdivision (a) (5), and may issue a certificate as a certified 5 6 public accountant to any person paying the application fee 7 provided in subsection (c) who possesses the qualifications specified in subdivisions (a) (1) through (a) (3), and what the 8 board determines to be substantially the equivalent of the 9 10 applicable qualifications under subdivision (a)(4), and who is 11 the holder of a certificate as a certified public accountant, 12 then in full force and effect, issued under the laws of any 13 state.

"(f) The board may make appropriate regulations to govern the issuance of a certificate as a certified public accountant to the holder of a certificate, license, or degree which is then in full force and effect in any foreign country constituting a recognized qualification for the practice of public accounting in the country, comparable to that of a certified public accountant of this state."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on
 January 1, 2016.
