1 Enrolled, An Act, 2 3 veterans or those who were a prisoner of war 4 while serving as a member of the United States Armed 5 Forces. 6 This bill would expand benefits to include the spouses of those who were killed while on state active 7 duty status or whose death results proximately and 8 9 within three years of an injury sustained while on 10 state active duty status. 11 Relating to the Department of Veterans Affairs; to 12 amend Section 31-6-5, as last amended by Act 2022-91, 2022 13 14 Regular Session, Code of Alabama 1975; to expand eligibility 15 for educational benefits to spouses of those who were killed 16 while on active state duty status or whose death results 17 proximately and within three years of an injury sustained 18 while on state active duty status. 19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 20 Section 1. Section 31-6-5, as last amended by Act 21 2022-91, 2022 Regular Session, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows: 22 23 "\$31-6-5 24 (a) Any spouse or widow whose spouse, during their 25 marriage:

26 (1) Was killed or died in the line of duty or is
27 listed as missing in action or is or was a prisoner of war

29	(2) Died from a disability incurred from military
30	service; <del>or</del>
31	(3) Was killed or died while on state active duty

35	$\frac{(3)}{(4)}$ Is 100 percent permanently and totally
36	disabled, whose permanent and total disabilities were
37	service-connected; shall be entitled to training in any
38	qualifying school for a period of five standard academic
39	years, not to exceed 45 months, or to training for the
40	equivalent of 45 months if enrolled part-time, pursuant to the
41	tuition reimbursement guidelines as provided in subsection
42	(c). One change of program will be allowed without counseling.
43	All training received under this section must be completed
44	within eight years after its initiation. This section shall
45	not apply to the spouse of any deceased serviceman or veteran
46	who has remarried prior to applying for and obtaining
47	educational benefits under this section, and should any spouse
48	of the deceased serviceman or veteran remarry during the time
49	he or she is in attendance upon any of the qualifying schools
50	mentioned in this section, then he or she shall pay tuition
51	and fees for the course of study or attendance upon the
52	qualifying school from the time of the remarriage.
53	(b) The educational benefits provided by this section
54	to spouses and widows making application for benefits for the
55	first time beginning with the fall term of the 2014-2015
56	academic year, and thereafter, shall be limited to





- undergraduate courses of study only, and the value of tuition paid shall be limited to the in-state tuition rate of the qualifying school attended.
- 60 (c) For those first filing for benefits under this chapter on or after July 31, 2017, and for those attending a 61 62 qualifying private school, the educational benefit shall be 63 for tuition reimbursement and books and fees reimbursement. 64 The value of tuition paid per semester hour (or equivalent) 65 shall be limited to the rate of the Department of Defense 66 Tuition Assistance Cap. The value of the books and fees paid 67 per semester shall be limited to one thousand dollars (\$1,000) per student." 68
- Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
