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SYNOPSIS:

5 This bill would authorize the creation of 6 firearms hold agreements, which are agreements between 7 a federal firearm licensee, or a municipal or county law enforcement officer, and an individual firearm 8 owner, where the licensee or law enforcement officer 9 10 agrees to hold a lawfully possessed firearm for a 11 specified period of time. This bill would also provide 12 civil immunity for federal firearm licensees or 13 municipal or county law enforcement officers who enter 14 into firearms hold agreements.

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Relating to firearms; to authorize and provide for the creation and implementation of firearms hold agreements, and provide civil immunity for federal firearm licensees or municipal or county law enforcement officers who enter into such agreements.

A BILL

TO BE ENTITLED

26 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

27 Section 1. (a) For the purposes of this act, the 28 following terms have the following meanings:

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- 29 (1) FEDERAL FIREARMS LICENSEE. Any individual who is 30 licensed pursuant to 18 U.S.C. Chapter 44.
- 31 (2) FIREARM. Any instrument as defined pursuant to 18
 32 U.S.C. §921.
- 33 (3) FIREARM HOLD AGREEMENT. A private transaction between a federal firearm licensee, or a municipal or county 34 35 law enforcement officer, and an individual firearm owner, 36 where the licensee or law enforcement officer takes physical possession of the owner's lawfully possessed firearm at the 37 owner's request, holds the firearm for an agreed period of 38 39 time, and returns the firearm to the owner according to the terms of the transaction. 40

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- (b) No individual shall have a cause of action against a federal firearm licensee, or municipal or county law enforcement officer, operating lawfully in this state for any act or omission arising from a firearms hold agreement and resulting in personal injury or death of any individual, including the return of any firearm by a federal firearm licensee, or municipal or county law enforcement officer, to the individual firearm owner at the termination of a firearms hold agreement.
- (c) The immunity from civil liability provided in subsection (b) shall not apply to any action arising from a firearms hold agreement if that action is the result of any unlawful conduct on the part of the federal firearm licensee or municipal or county law enforcement officer.
- 55 (d) This section shall not apply to firearm transfers 56 made in violation of any prohibited act set forth in Title 13A



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- or Chapter 27 of Title 41 of the Code of Alabama 1975.
