27		TO BE ENTITIED

Relating to health care; to require any adult applying for or receiving health care benefits subsidized by the state to be tested initially and periodically for substance abuse; to provide for the Department of Public Health to be responsible for having the testing administered; to provide that any positive tests may not be admissible in any criminal proceeding; to provide for the ineligibility of any adult who tests positive; to provide for payment of the tests; to provide for the Public Health Officer to promulgate rules pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act to implement this act; and to provide for exemptions.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. This act shall be known and cited as the Patient Accountability and Personal Responsibility Act.

Section 2. (a) The Department of Public Health shall design and implement a substance abuse screening program for any adult receiving or seeking to receive health care benefits subsidized by the state, with the screening program including periodic testing of the adult's blood or urine for the presence of controlled substances as set out in subsection (b).

(b) Any adult shall be ineligible for state subsidized health care benefits if any of the following occurs:

- 1 (1) The adult does not participate in the substance 2 abuse screening program established pursuant to subsection 3 (a).
  - (2) The adult tests positive in a substance abuse test administered by the program for the presence of any of the following:
    - a. A Schedule I controlled substance.
  - b. A Schedule II-V controlled substance not
    prescribed for that adult.

- (c) The substance abuse testing component of the screening program shall be designed so as to require that testing occurs as an initial condition precedent prior to the receipt of subsidized health care benefits and once for each subsequent year the adult receives subsidized health care benefits with the adult being randomly assigned a month within that year to submit to testing upon receipt of reasonable notice from the department.
- (d) The results of testing conducted pursuant to this section shall not be admissible in any criminal proceeding without the consent of the person tested.
- (e) The cost of periodic tests shall be added to the tested adult's portion of the premium.
- (f) The Public Health Officer shall promulgate rules pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act to prescribe the design, operation, and standards for the implementation of this act.

Section 3. Persons receiving state subsidized health care benefits who are residents of a nursing home, penal facility, mental health facility, or any other long-term care facility shall be exempt from Section 2.

Section 4. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
