1 SB581 2 3 4 ENGROSSED 5 6 7 A BTTT TO BE ENTITLED 8 9 AN ACT 10 11 To propose an amendment to the Constitution of 12 Alabama of 1901, relating to Baldwin County; to provide that 13 only county-owned solid waste landfills may be used for the disposal of garbage, household waste, industrial solid waste, 14 15 and solid waste; to exempt the disposal of certain inert debris and construction materials from the proposed amendment; 16 17 to provide for certain exempted contracts; to provide that the 18 county may not charge rates exceeding rates for similar 19 services charged by public and private landfill operators in surrounding counties; to provide for violations to the 20 21 amendment; to require the county governing body to create the 22 Baldwin County Solid Waste Management Authority to make 23 recommendations to the county governing body relating to the 24 operation of county landfills; and to allow the implementation and administration by local acts of the Legislature; and to 25 26 provide that the proposed amendment, if adopted, and any

implementing local laws would terminate three years following
 the ratification date of the amendment.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

4 Section 1. The following amendment to the 5 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, is proposed and shall become 6 valid as a part of the Constitution when all requirements of 7 this act are fulfilled:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

9 (a) Subject to the automatic termination of this 10 amendment and any enabling local laws enacted pursuant to this amendment, and except as provided in subsection (c) to exempt 11 12 certain contracts and to exempt the disposal of certain inert 13 debris and construction materials, in Baldwin County, only 14 county-owned solid waste landfills may be used for the 15 disposal of garbage, household waste, industrial solid waste, and solid waste as defined in Section 22-27-1 et seq., Code of 16 17 Alabama 1975. The rates for disposal at county-owned or operated solid waste landfills shall not exceed the 18 established gate rates for similar services charged by 19 publicly or privately owned solid waste landfills that process 20 21 similar average daily volumes as the county-owned or operated 22 landfills in the following counties: Mobile, Escambia, 23 Washington, Monroe, Clarke, Conecuh, and Escambia County, 24 Florida.

(b) The county governing body shall create the
Baldwin County Solid Waste Management Authority comprised of
five members at least two of whom shall be mayors of

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1 municipalities in Baldwin County. The committee shall
2 recommend methods of operation, communications, rates,
3 municipal recycling programs, revenue sharing, and other solid
4 waste landfill functions as requested by the county governing
5 body.

6 (c)(1) Contracts in effect on December 1, 2009, 7 between municipalities and other entities for solid waste 8 collection and disposal, including, but not limited to, 9 dumpster contracts and recycling programs, are exempt from 10 this amendment.

11 (2) The disposal of inert debris including, but not 12 limited to, leaves, limbs, brush, and yard debris and 13 construction materials collected for disposal by a 14 municipality at a municipal or private facility is exempt from 15 the requirements of this amendment.

(d) Any person, firm, or corporation found in 16 17 violation of this amendment shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be fined not less than fifty 18 dollars (\$50) nor more than two hundred dollars (\$200), and if 19 the violation or failure or refusal to obey or comply with 20 21 this amendment is a continuing one, each day's violation shall 22 constitute a separate offense and shall be punished 23 accordingly. All citations to violators of this article shall be served by any lawful officer or by the Solid Waste Officer. 24

(e) The Legislature, by local law, may provide for
 the implementation and administration of the provisions of
 this amendment.

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(f) This amendment, if adopted and ratified, and any
 local law enacted pursuant to this amendment shall
 automatically terminate and have no further force or effect of
 law three years following the ratification of this amendment.

5 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment 6 shall be held in accordance with Amendment 555 to the 7 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 8 284.01 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of 9 Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this 10 state.

Section 3. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the following description of the substance or subject matter of the proposed constitutional amendment:

"Relating to Baldwin County, proposing an amendment 16 17 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to provide that only county-owned solid waste landfills may be used for the 18 disposal of garbage, household waste, industrial solid waste 19 and solid waste; to exempt the disposal of certain inert 20 21 debris and construction materials from the proposed amendment; 22 to provide that the county may not charge established gate 23 rates exceeding the rates for similar services charged by 24 public and private solid waste landfill operators in surrounding counties; to provide for violations to the 25 26 amendment; to provide that the Baldwin County governing body 27 shall create the Baldwin County Solid Waste Management

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Authority to recommend methods of operation, rates, and other 1 2 functions requested by the Baldwin County governing body; and to authorize local laws for the implementation and 3 administration of the provisions of the amendment; and 4 5 providing that the amendment and any local law implementing the amendment automatically terminate three years following 6 7 the ratification of the constitutional amendment. "Proposed by Act _____." 8 9 This description shall be followed by the following 10 language:
