20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
21	Section 1. The following amendment to the

25	accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

27

Section I. The Legislature shall convene in organizational session as provided for in Amendment 57 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 48.01 of Article IV of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended. Beginning with the first regular session after January 1, 2014, the annual regular session of the Legislature shall commence on the first Tuesday in March of the first year of the term of office of legislators, on the first Tuesday of February of the second and third years of the term, and on the second Tuesday in January of the fourth year of the term, or on such other day as may be prescribed by law, and shall be limited to 60 calendar days and 20 legislative days. During the annual regular session, legislation of any nature may be considered by the Legislature with the exception of the following: General appropriation bills for the ordinary expenses of the executive, legislative, and judicial departments of the state; bills whose primary purpose is to increase or decrease revenues; bills for interest on the public debt; bills authorizing bond issues; appropriation bills for the support and maintenance of public education; nonstate and other appropriation bills; and any other appropriation bills. On the second Tuesday after the final adjournment of the annual regular session of the Legislature, the annual budget session of the Legislature shall commence, and shall be limited to 45 calendar days and 10 legislative days. During the budget session, only bills whose primary purpose is to increase or

1 decrease revenues; general appropriation bills for the 2 ordinary expenses of the executive, legislative, and judicial departments of the state; bills for interest on the public 3 debt; bills authorizing bond issues; bills for the support and maintenance of public education; nonstate and other 5 6 appropriation bills; any other legislation dealing with 7 emergency financial needs of the state; or local legislation may be considered by the Legislature. When the Legislature 8 shall be convened in special session, there shall be no 9 10 legislation upon subjects other than those designated in the proclamation of the Governor calling the session, except by 11 12 vote of two-thirds of each house. Special sessions of the 13 Legislature convened in the manner provided by this 14 constitution shall be limited to 12 legislative days and 30 15 calendar days.

Section II. On or before the first legislative day of each annual regular session of the Legislature, the Governor shall transmit to the Legislature the proposed budget plans of the state for consideration by the Legislature in the next ensuing budget session.

Section III. This amendment shall be self-executing.

Amendment 339 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 76 of Article IV of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and Amendment 448 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 71.01 of Article IV of the

Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, are repealed.

Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this state.

Section 3. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the following description of the substance or subject matter of the proposed constitutional amendment:

"Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, relative to the dates, times, and length of organizational, annual regular, annual budget, and special sessions of the Legislature; to provide for the nature of legislation that may be considered in regular and budget sessions of the Legislature; to specify when the Governor shall submit to the Legislature the proposed budget plans of the state; and to repeal Amendment 339 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 76 of Article IV of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and Amendment 448 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 71.01 of Article IV of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended.
