11	WHEREAS, with the conclusion of the 2019-2022
12	quadrennium of the Legislature of Alabama, Senator Del Marsh
13	will end an accomplished legislative career spanning over two
14	decades; and
15	WHEREAS, Senator Marsh first won election to
16	represent the 12th Senate District in the Alabama Senate in
17	1998, and has been reelected to that office five times; in
18	2010, he was chosen as President Pro Tempore of the Alabama
19	Senate, an office he held until last year; when a vacancy
20	occurred in the office of Lieutenant Governor following
21	succession of Governor Kay Ivey to her current position in
22	2017, Senator Marsh presided over the Senate for two years;

24	WHEREAS, just as anyone who knows Senator Marsh can
25	confirm, sitting on the chair as presiding officer of the
26	Senate was not for him; the "honey badger" of the State House

needed to work the floor, sniff for votes, and claw his way to

bill passage; he felt that the chair sometimes got in his way;
as such, he stepped down from his post as President Pro
Tempore, in order to re-enter the fray; and

WHEREAS, Senator Marsh treasures his wife, Ginger, and is father to two wonderful children: Justin, married to wife Carolyne; and Christine, married to husband Wil; Senator Marsh also has six grandchildren whom he loves dearly; and

WHEREAS, Senator Marsh's wife, Ginger, is a public school educator, and his children are products of the public education system; as such, Senator Marsh has championed the cause of public education throughout his Senate career; one of the highlights of his legislative portfolio is the Alabama Accountability Act, to ensure proper use of education resources and to provide for more school choice in Alabama; he has continued to fight for this cause during his final days serving in the Senate chamber; indeed, the State House's own "honey badger" has duly earned that maverick reputation through his perseverance and tenacity in advocating for his legislative proposals; and

WHEREAS, in addition to serving ex officio on every
Senate committee during his tenure as President of the Senate,
Senator Marsh has lent his judgment and expertise to all of
the following Senate standing committees: the Judiciary
Committee; the Finance and Taxation, Education Committee; the
Local Legislation Committee; the Governmental Affairs
Committee; and the Tourism Committee, as chair, as well as the
former Tourism and Marketing Committee, also as chair;

additionally, he has served on the Permanent Joint Legislative

Advisory Committee on Economic Incentives; and
