solutions for the education of Alabama's next generation; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That there is created the
Farm-to-Schools Task Force to study and develop a
farm-to-school food program facilitating the purchase of fresh
vegetables and other produce from local farmers and producers
by the state or local boards of education to alleviate the
current food shortage in public schools in this state.

- (a) The task force shall consist of the following members:
  - (1) Four senators appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.
- (2) Four representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
  - (3) One member appointed by the Governor.
  - (4) The Superintendent of Education, or his or her designee.
  - (5) The Commissioner of the Department of Agriculture and Industries, or his or her designee.
    - (6) The Director of Finance, or his or her designee.
  - (b) All appointing authorities shall coordinate their appointments so that diversity of gender, race, and geographical areas is reflective of the makeup of this state.
  - (c)(1) Each legislative member of the task force shall be entitled to his or her regular legislative compensation, per diem, and travel expenses for each day of

attendance at a meeting of the task force in accordance with

Amendment 871 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901.

- (2) Each non-legislative member of the task force may be reimbursed for necessary expenses and travel for each day of attendance at a meeting of the task force according to the policies and practices of the employers of the members appointed.
- (d) The Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall call the first meeting of the task force, which must be held not later than December 1, 2022. The task force shall elect a co-chair from the House of Representatives and a co-chair from the Senate at its first meeting.
- (e) The Legislative Services Agency, the Clerk of the House of Representatives, and the Secretary of the Senate shall provide administrative and other assistance for the work of the task force as necessary.
- (f) The task force may hold meetings at the call of the chair or a majority of its members.
- (g) The task force hall present a report of its findings, which shall include its recommendations for legislation or other measures necessary for the successful implementation of a farm-to-schools program, if any, to the Legislature on or before the last legislative day of the 2022 Regular Session, at which time it shall stand dissolved.
