4 SECTION 25. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 5 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
 6 PROVISION. In the event the State Insurance Department is unable to maintain
 7 a full roster of examination personnel, and upon approval of the Chief Fiscal
 8 Officer of the State, the resulting unused appropriations in Regular
 9 Salaries, Extra Help, and Personal Services Matching may be transferred to
 10 the Professional Services special line item for the purpose of contracting
 11 with qualified individuals or firms for examination assistance.

15 SECTION 26. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE

17 (a) As used in this section, "Health Care Independence Program" means
 18 the Health Care Independence Program established under the Health Care
 19 Independence Act of 2013, Arkansas Code § 20-77-2401 et seq.

20 (b)(1) Determining the maximum number of employees, the maximum amount
 21 of appropriation, for what purposes an appropriation is authorized, and
 22 general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year is the
 23 prerogative of the General Assembly.

24 (2) The purposes of subdivision (b)(1) of this section are
 25 typically accomplished by:

26 (A) Identifying the purpose in the appropriation act;

27 (B) Delineating such maximums in the appropriation act for

5 SECTION 28 COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
 6 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
 7 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
 8 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
 9 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary

15 SECTION 29. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
 16 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations

 19 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
 20 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
 21 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative

24 SECTION 30. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
 25 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
 26 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
 27 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2014 is essential to the operation of
 28 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
 29 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
 30 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2014 could work irreparable harm
 31 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
 32 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
 33 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
 34 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2014.
