21 WHEREAS, after more than 10 years as Chancellor of the University of
22 Arkansas at Monticello, Dr. Jack Lassiter, a native of Greenville, Texas, and
23 the first of 2 children born to parents Zelda and Harold Jackson Lassiter,
24 Sr., retired on January 5, 2015; and

25
26 WHEREAS, Dr. Lassiter earned a bachelor's degree in business
27 administration from Texas A&M University-Commerce, then known as East Texas
28 State University, in 1968. He was the first in his extended family to attend
29 college; he earned his master's degree in guidance and counseling in 1969;
30 and he went on to pursue his doctorate of education degree from Texas A&M,
31 Commerce, in 1976 while serving as an adjunct instructor at Richland
32 Community College in Dallas, Texas; and

34 WHEREAS, Dr. Lassiter first joined the University of Arkansas at
35 Monticello in 1977 as the director of the Learning Development Center; he
36 then served as dean of college and student services at Wharton County Junior



1 College in Texas for 2 years; in 1980, he returned to UAM and held the
2 position of vice chancellor for university relations and student services for
3 13 years and vice chancellor for academic affairs for 4 years; and
4

5 WHEREAS, Dr. Lassiter served as Chancellor of the University of
6 Arkansas Community College at Batesville from 1997-2001 and as the vice
7 president of the University of Arkansas System in Little Rock, Arkansas from
8 2001-2004; and
9

10 WHEREAS, Dr. Lassiter returned to UAM in 2004 as the 11th chancellor of
11 the university and held the position until his retirement in 2015; he had the
12 distinction of leading the institution during its centennial celebration from
13 April 1, 2009, to September 14, 2010; and
14

15 WHEREAS, some of Dr. Lassiter's many accomplishments as chancellor at
16 UAM include the Taylor House and Hollywood Plantation revitalization project;
17 the remodeling of Convoy Leslie-Cotton Boll Stadium; the construction of the
18 indoor practice facility for athletics, the marching band, and intramurals;
19 renovations to the baseball and softball complexes; the creation of the
20 Centennial Circle Endowment and the construction of the Centennial Clock
21 Tower; the remodeling of Bankston Hall, Wells Hall, and Sorrells Hall; the
22 purchase and remodeling of the Trotter House Bed and Breakfast; and the
23 expansion of the George H. Clippert Forest Resources Annex; and

25 WHEREAS, one of Dr. Lassiter's most popular achievements is the
26 rehabilitation of the Weevil Pond, which provides the university and
27 community a tailgating atmosphere before Boll Weevil football games, and more
28 importantly, a lasting tradition; and
29

30 WHEREAS, Dr. Lassiter made significant curriculum changes at UAM,
31 including the creation of online master's degrees and upgrades to existing
32 programs; the curriculum changes allow the university to assist students
33 through technical certificates all the way to master's degrees; and
34

35 WHEREAS, while Dr. Lassiter served as chancellor at UAM, he
36 reestablished a meaningful relationship between the university and the

1 surrounding community, strengthening the university's mission as an open
2 admissions university and creating a welcoming atmosphere that encourages the
3 community to feel connected to the university; and
4

5 WHEREAS Dr. Lassiter established stronger alumni relationships,
6 instilled an unprecedented level of transparency in university operations,
7 and saw a meaningful growth in the university's enrollment; and
8

9 WHEREAS during Dr. Lassiter's 28 years at UAM, he shared a special bond
10 with the institution, students, and community; he helped establish a school
11 spirit that permeates the campus and community, making people proud to ask,
12 "Do you have what it takes to be a Boll Weevil?"; and
13

14 WHEREAS, Dr. Lassiter and his wife, Judy, are proud to have chosen
15 Monticello to call home and will continue to reside in Monticello after Dr.
16 Lassiter's retirement,

18 NOW THEREFORE,

19 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETIETH GENERAL
20 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

22 THAT Dr. H. Jackson Lassiter be commended for his many contributions to
23 the University of Arkansas at Monticello and the community.
