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20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
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22	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 17-86-102, concerning the definitions	
23	regarding the practice of massage therapy, is amended to add additional	
24	subdivisions to read as follows:	
25	(12) "Massage therapy apprentice" means a person who is enrolled	<u>ed</u>
26	in a massage therapy apprenticeship program;	
27	(13) "Massage therapy apprenticeship program" means a program	
28	that meets the federal guidelines set out in 29 C.F.R. Part 29, as existing	
29	on March 1, 2021, and is approved by the United States Office of	
30	Apprenticeship;	
31	(14) "Massage therapy learning permit" means a permit issued by	У
32	the Department of Health before enrollment in a massage therapy	
33	apprenticeship program or in a massage therapy school that is valid for no	
34	longer than six (6) months after completion of the apprenticeship or	
35	graduation from the massage therapy school; and	
36	(15) "Massage therapy student" means a person who is enrolled:	<u>in</u>

1	a licensed massage therapy school or postsecondary massage therapy school.
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3	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 17-86-104 is amended to read as follows:
4	17-86-104. Criminal background checks.
5	An applicant applying for enrollment in a massage therapy school,
6	postsecondary massage therapy school, or massage therapy apprenticeship
7	program or applying as a new massage therapy licensee, an individual applying
8	for a new massage therapy school license, or a licensee applying for an
9	upgrade issued by the Department of Health shall apply to the Identification
10	Bureau of the Department <u>Division</u> of Arkansas State Police for a state and
11	federal criminal background check to be conducted by the Identification
12	Bureau of the Division of Arkansas State Police and the Federal Bureau of
13	Investigation.
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15	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 17-86-203(d)(1), concerning the powers and
16	duties of the State Board of Health and the Department of Health to regulate
17	the practice of massage therapy, is amended to read as follows:
18	(d)(1) The department may require each original applicant enrolling in
19	a massage therapy school, postsecondary massage therapy school, or massage
20	therapy apprenticeship program, or applying as a new massage therapy licensee
21	to practice in the State of Arkansas and each upgrade applicant for a license
22	issued by the Department of Health <u>department</u> to apply to the Identification
23	Bureau of the Division of Arkansas State Police for a state and federal
24	criminal background check to be conducted by the Identification Bureau of the
25	Division of Arkansas State Police and the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
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27	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 17-86-301(a) and (b), concerning
28	registration to practice massage therapy, is amended to read as follows:
29	(a) It shall be unlawful:
30	(1) (A) For any person who does not hold a valid license to use
31	the following titles: massage therapist, massage practitioner, myotherapist,
32	massotherapist, massage technologist, masseur, masseuse, therapy
33	technologist, master massage therapist, massage therapy instructor, or any
34	derivation of those titles or to advertise such titles; or
35	$\frac{(B)}{(2)}$ For any person who does not hold the applicable
36	license issued by the Department of Health to engage professionally for

- payment, barter, donation, or exchange in the practice or instruction of massage therapy as defined in this chapter;
- 3 (2)(3) For any person to operate or conduct any massage therapy
 4 clinic or massage therapy school which does not conform to the sanitary rules
 5 contained in § 17-86-302, in state law, in local ordinances, or in those
 6 rules which may be adopted by the State Board of Health;
- 7 (3)(4) To employ any person to practice or instruct under this 8 chapter who does not hold a valid license issued by the department;
- 9 (4)(5) For any person to operate a massage therapy school or clinic without its first being registered under the provisions of this chapter as a licensed massage therapy school or registered clinic; or
- 12 (5)(6) For any massage therapy school or postsecondary massage
 13 therapy school to enroll any person in the massage therapy school or
 14 postsecondary school who does not hold a massage therapy learning permit
 15 issued by the department;
- 16 (7) For any massage therapy apprenticeship program to enroll any
 17 person in the massage therapy apprenticeship program who does not hold a
 18 massage therapy learning permit issued by the department; or
 - (8)(A) For the department or other individual or entity to incorporate privileges or certification requirements of any private organization, private professional association, or private accrediting agency within Arkansas massage laws or its rules.
 - (B) However, the department may adopt as its licensure exam an exam drafted and administered by a private organization, private professional association, or private accreditation agency.
 - (b) Exemptions:

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- (1) Persons authorized by the laws of this state to practice medicine, osteopathy, podiatry, or physical therapy, and licensed physicians' assistants, licensed nurses, licensed physical therapy assistants, licensed acupuncturists, licensed midwives, and chiropractors are exempt from this chapter in so far as massage therapy practices are offered or instructed within the scope and under the provisions of licensure;
- (2) <u>Persons licensed as a massage therapy student who practice</u> under the direct supervision of a massage therapy instructor at a licensed massage therapy school or licensed postsecondary massage therapy school for a period not to exceed six (6) months from the date of graduation from the

1	massage therapy school;
2	(3) Persons licensed as a massage therapy apprentice who
3	practice under the direct supervision of a massage therapy instructor who is
4	registered or approved as a sponsor as part of the massage therapy
5	apprenticeship program approval by the United States Office of
6	Apprenticeship, for a period not to exceed six (6) months from the date of
7	completion of the massage therapy apprenticeship program;
8	(4) Persons authorized by the department to present and instruct
9	department-approved school curriculum or continuing education programs, or
10	both, may present and instruct such department-approved curriculum and
11	programs for payment and in the presentation and instruction may utilize
12	practices defined in, but without being licensed or registered under, the
13	provisions of this chapter; and
14	(3) (5) The practice of massage therapy that is incidental to a
15	program of study by students enrolled in a licensed massage therapy school
16	approved by the department, and under direct supervision of a licensee
17	employed as an instructor at the school, is exempt from § 17-86-311(a)(10).
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19	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 17-86-303 is amended to read as follows:
20	17-86-303. Massage therapist.
21	(a) In order to be licensed as a massage therapist, the person seeking
22	licensure shall:
23	(1) Furnish to the Department of Health satisfactory proof that
24	he or she is eighteen (18) years of age or older;
25	(2) Make oath that he or she has not been convicted of, found
26	guilty of, or entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to any offense that
27	would constitute a felony listed under § 17-3-102 or constitute the offense
28	of prostitution, either in this state or another state, and submit a signed
29	authorization to investigate and have information released to the department;
30	(3) Present the following issued in the same name as the
31	applicant or licensee:
32	(A) A valid photo identification or driver's license, or
33	both; and
34	(B) A Social Security card;
35	(4)(A) Present a high school diploma, high school equivalency
36	diploma approved by the Adult Education Section, or college transcript and

T	credentials issued by a massage therapy school accepted by the department or
2	a like institution with no less than five hundred (500) hours of in-classroom
3	instruction.
4	(B) An applicant shall not submit his or her transcript
5	directly to the department.
6	(C) An applicant shall request that the massage therapy
7	school submit the transcript directly to the department.
8	(D)(i) If the applicant's transcript is not obtainable
9	from the original school, the applicant shall submit a statement to explain
10	why the transcript may not be obtained.
11	(ii) Other documentation of credentials may be
12	submitted and accepted for licensure at the discretion of the department;
13	(5) Furnish to the department satisfactory proof of passing an
14	examination recognized and approved by the department; and
15	(6) Pay the specified fees, which shall accompany a completed
16	notarized application to the department.
17	(a) For an applicant seeking enrollment in a massage therapy school or
18	massage therapy apprenticeship program on or after January 1, 2024, in order
19	to be issued a massage therapy learning permit, the applicant seeking
20	enrollment in a massage therapy school or massage therapy apprenticeship
21	<pre>program shall:</pre>
22	(1) Furnish to the Department of Health satisfactory proof that
23	the applicant is eighteen (18) years of age or older;
24	(2) Make oath that the applicant has not been convicted of,
25	found guilty of, or entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to any
26	offense that would constitute a felony listed under § 17-3-102 or constitute
27	the offense of prostitution, either in this state or another state, and
28	submit a signed authorization to investigate and have information released to
29	the department;
30	(3) Provide a state and federal criminal background check to the
31	department as provided in § 17-86-104;
32	(4) Present the following issued in the same name as the
33	applicant or licensee:
34	(A) A valid photo identification card or driver's license,
35	or both; and
36	(B) A Social Security card:

1	(5) Request the massage therapy school or massage therapy
2	apprenticeship program in which the applicant is seeking to enroll or has
3	enrolled to send a copy of the enrollment contract, or equivalent
4	confirmation of enrollment to the department; and
5	(6) Pay the specified fees as provided in subsection (d) of this
6	section, which shall accompany a completed notarized application to the
7	department.
8	(b) For an applicant who was issued a massage therapy learning permit
9	on or after January 1, 2024, an applicant holding a massage therapy learning
10	permit under subsection (a) of this section, upon graduating from a massage
11	therapy school or completing a massage therapy apprenticeship program, shall:
12	(1) Request the massage therapy school or massage therapy
13	apprenticeship program submit directly to the department either:
14	(A) A transcript and credentials issued by a massage
15	therapy school; or
16	(B) A certificate of completion issued by a massage
17	therapy apprenticeship program;
18	(2) Furnish to the department satisfactory proof of passing an
19	examination recognized and approved by the department;
20	(3) Make oath that the applicant has not been convicted of,
21	found guilty of, or entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to any
22	offense that would constitute a felony listed under § 17-3-102 or constitute
23	the offense of prostitution, either in this state or another state, since the
24	date the massage therapy learning permit was issued, and submit a signed
25	authorization to investigate and have information released to the department;
26	(4) Submit a completed application provided by the department
27	for issuance of licensure; and
28	(5) Pay the specified fees as provided in subsection (d) of this
29	section.
30	(c) In order to be licensed as a massage therapist, the person seeking
31	licensure under § 17-86-308 or subsection (g) of this section or through
32	similar reciprocity provisions as provided by the rules established by the
33	department shall:
34	(1) Furnish to the department satisfactory proof that the
35	applicant is eighteen (18) years of age or older;
36	(2) Make oath that the applicant has not been convicted of,

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2	offense that would constitute a felony listed under § 17-3-102 or constitute
3	the offense of prostitution, either in this state or another state, and
4	submit a signed authorization to investigate and have information released to
5	the department;
6	(3) Provide a state and federal criminal background check to the
7	department as provided in § 17-86-104;
8	(4) Present the following issued in the same name as the
9	applicant or licensee:
10	(A) A valid photo identification card or driver's license,
11	or both; and
12	(B) A Social Security card;
13	(5)(A) Present a high school diploma, high school equivalency
14	diploma approved by the Adult Education Section, or college transcript and
15	credentials issued by a massage therapy school accepted by the department or
16	an equivalent institution with no less than five hundred (500) hours of in-
17	classroom instruction.
18	(B) An applicant shall not submit his or her transcript
19	directly to the department.
20	(C) An applicant shall request that the massage therapy
21	school submit the transcript directly to the department.
22	(D)(i) If the applicant's transcript is not obtainable
23	from the original school, the applicant shall submit a statement to explain
24	why the transcript can not be obtained.
25	(ii) Other documentation of credentials may be
26	submitted and accepted for licensure at the discretion of the department;
27	(6) Furnish to the department satisfactory proof of passing an
28	examination recognized and approved by the department; and
29	(7) Pay the specified fees as provided in subsection (d) of this
30	section, which shall accompany a completed notarized application to the
31	department.
32	(b) (d) Fees are as follows:
33	(1) Application Massage therapy learning permit application fee
34	\$75.00 Nonrefundable under subsection (a) of this section
35	(2) Reciprocity license application fee75.00
36	Nonrefundable under subsection (c) of this section

T	(2) Original license lee 80.00 under subsection

4	(4)(5) Examination fee or reexamination fee 25.00
5	(5)(6) Duplicate license fee 10.00
6	$\frac{(6)}{(7)}$ Pocket card fee not to exceed ten dollars (\$10.00).
7	(e)(e) A person shall not practice massage therapy unless he or she
8	holds a valid massage therapy learning permit by the department or until his
9	or her official license has been received from the department.
10	$\frac{(d)(f)}{(f)}$ A person who attempts to procure or does procure a license in
11	violation of this section shall be subject to the penalties provided for in §
12	17-86-103.
13	(g) A person who was enrolled in a massage therapy school,
14	postsecondary massage therapy school, or massage therapy apprenticeship
15	program as of January 1, 2024, or has completed or graduated from a massage
16	therapy school, postsecondary massage therapy school, or massage therapy
17	apprenticeship program before January 1, 2024, may seek licensure as provided
18	in subsection (c) of this section.
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
