FACT SHEET FOR S.B. 1126

appropriation; behavioral risk factor survey

Purpose

Appropriates \$160,000 from the state General Fund (state GF) in FY 2022 to the Arizona Department of Health Services (DHS) for an Arizona-specific behavioral risk factor surveillance survey (survey).

Background

DHS is responsible for protecting the health of the people of Arizona by promoting the development, maintenance, efficiency and effectiveness of local health departments and districts (A.R.S. § 36-132).

Established in 1984, the Arizona Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System telephone survey is used to monitor selected public health objectives related to general health status, health-related quality of life and well-being and determinants of health and disparities (DHS).

S.B. 1126 appropriates \$160,000 from the state GF in FY 2022 to DHS for the survey.

Provisions

- 1. Appropriates \$160,000 from the state GF in FY 2022 to DHS for a survey on cognitive decline and caregiver modules.
- 2. Becomes effective on the general effective date.
