SB 1151: contracts; licensure requirements; exemption; exclusion.

Overview

Removes the exemption from private postsecondary education licensure and certification laws provided to a person who meets specified requirements.

History

The State Board for Private Postsecondary Education regulates private postsecondary education by issuing licenses to grant degrees and licenses to operate private vocational programs. A person may not operate a private vocational program, grant or offer to grant a degree, or operate an institution that grants or offers to grant a degree unless the person holds the appropriate license ([A.R.S. § 32-3022](#)).

A person who is party to a private contract that meets outlined requirements is exempt from specified laws relating to licensure, certification, registration or other authorization to act, including requirements relating to private postsecondary education. The contract must: 1) be substantially delivered electronically; 2) specify the laws from which the person is exempt; 3) be of a subject that is lawful; and 4) not exceed \$6,000 per transaction and \$150,000 in aggregate profit for all parties in the previous calendar year ([A.R.S. § 44-171](#)).

Provisions

1. Removes the exemption, from state postsecondary education laws relating to licensure, certification, registration or other authorization, provided to a person who meets specified requirements.
2. Makes technical changes. (Sec. 1)
