SB 1410: appropriation; new facility; Kirkland elementary

<u>Overview</u>

Appropriates \$3,000,000 to the School Facilities Board (SFB) to distribute to Kirkland Elementary School District for the replacement of a current school building.

<u>History</u>

SFB is responsible for providing capital funding to school districts through three primary funds: the Emergency Deficiencies Correction Fund (EDC), the New School Facilities Fund and the Building Renewal Grant (BRG) Fund. Its functions and obligations include:

- 1) Holding a database of school facilities that receive funding from the BRG Fund and the new school facilities formula;
- 2) Engaging in routine inspections at least every five years to ensure building adequacy standards are met:
- 3) Reviewing and approving student population projections submitted by school districts;
- 4) Developing prototypical elementary and high school designs and certifying that plans for new facilities meet building adequacy standards;
- 5) Developing application and reporting forms and procedures, including establishing a project eligibility assessment for all projects submitted for BRG or EDC funding;
- 6) Submitting reports regarding activities and disbursements:
- 7) Adopting minimum school facility adequacy guidelines; and
- 8) Validating proposed adjacent ways projects (A.R.S. § 15-2002).

The Kirkland Elementary School District is located in Kirkland, Arizona that serves students in preschool through the 8th grade. In FY 2020, the district maintained one school and served 70 students (Arizona School District Spending Report).

Provisions

- 1. Appropriates \$3,000,000 from the state General Fund in FY 2022 to SFB to distribute to Kirkland Elementary School District to replace an existing school facility building. (Sec.1)
- 2. Exempts the appropriation from lapsing. (Sec. 1)
