#### **Description of Amendments in This Packet**

**J.001** Bill Sponsor amendment **J.001** (attached) adds a provision appropriating a total of \$2,000,000 to the Department of Local Affairs for FY 2021-22, including \$1,000,000

JBC Staff Fiscal Analysis 1

General Fund appropriated to the Peace Officers Mental Health Support and Community Partnership Fund and \$1,000,000 reappropriated funds from that fund to the Department of Local Affairs to support the grant program.

## **Points to Consider**

## General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2021-22 based on the March 2021 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The budget package includes a set aside of \$48.0 million General Fund for bills that require General Fund appropriations for FY 2021-22. Amendment **J.001** requires a General Fund appropriation of \$1,000,000 for FY 2021-22, which would reduce the \$48.0 million set aside by the same amount.
