## **Summary of Legislation**

Current law allows electroconvulsive treatment (ECT) to be performed on minors who are under the age of 16 years old only if certain conditions are met. The bill repeals the requirement that ECT must be necessary to treat life-threatening malignant catatonia. It also requires one of the two licensed individuals who approve ECT for a minor to specialize in child and adolescent psychiatry.

### **State Expenditures**

Starting in 2025-26, workload in the Department of Regulatory Agencies, the Department of Public Health and Environment, and the Behavioral Health Administration will minimally increase to update rules, procedures, and technical forms for licensed medical professionals and health care facilities, and to respond to complaints. This workload is expected to be minimal and no change in appropriations is required.

#### **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
