The bill prohibits an institution of higher education from giving a legacy admissions preference to an applicant. It increases workload for some institutions of higher education.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status: The fiscal note reflects the introduced bill.

Summary of Legislation

The bill prohibits a state-supported institution of higher education from giving admissions preference to an applicant because they are related to alumni of the institution. Institutions may ask questions regarding familial relationships to alumni in order to collect data.

State Expenditures

For any institution that has legacy admissions in place, the bill increases workload by a minimal amount to modify admissions policies. The fiscal note assumes that most state institutions do not have such policies in place, and thus will experience no change in workload. No change in appropriations is required.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
