Bill Summary

The bill requires public and private higher education institutions to print Colorado and national crisis and suicide prevention contact information on student identification cards. If an institution does not use student identification cards, the bill requires the school to distribute Colorado and national crisis and suicide prevention contact information to the student body each semester or trimester.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

2 SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. (1) The general assembly
3 finds and declares that:

4 (a) Young adulthood, which is commonly considered to be ages 5 19 to 24, is a time of often stressful transitions during which some major mental health conditions first emerge. Young adults with untreated or 6 7 undiagnosed behavioral health problems often face academic and 8 personal problems and sometimes drop out of school. This age group also 9 has a significantly higher rate of suicide compared to youth ages 10 to 18. 10 The Colorado department of public health and environment reports that 11 between 2003 and 2017 there were 1,290 suicides among young adults 12 ages 19 to 24 and 696 suicides among youth ages 10 to 18.

(b) Providing access to mental health care is one way to prevent suicide. The American Foundation for Suicide Prevention reports in a 2022 policy paper on suicide on university and college campuses that only half of enrolled students said they knew where to find mental health services. This suggests that postsecondary institutions should make students more aware of suicide prevention resources and services.

(2) Therefore, it is the intent of the general assembly that this bill
 increase awareness of mental health resources, and the general assembly
 recognizes this awareness as an important step toward preventing suicide
 and promoting well-being among young adults.

23 SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 23-5-109 as
24 follows:

25 23-5-109. Identification - suicide and crisis prevention - rules.
26 (1) The governing board of any state institution of higher education is

1 authorized to promulgate rules and regulations establishing a system of 2 identification of students, faculty, and staff which THAT may include 3 provisions for penalties other than criminal penalties and provisions for 4 disciplinary action for failure to display one's identification card upon 5 request by an authorized official, possession of a false identification card, 6 and alteration of an identification card. The authorized officials of such 7 institution have authority to detain a person upon the property under the 8 control of the institution for the purpose of obtaining proper identification 9 if such person refuses to display his THE PERSON'S identification card or 10 otherwise give adequate identification upon request by an authorized 11 official.

12 (2) EACH STUDENT IDENTIFICATION CARD ISSUED AFTER AUGUST 13 1, 2023, TO A PUBLIC OR PRIVATE POSTSECONDARY SCHOOL STUDENT 14 MUST INCLUDE THE PHONE NUMBER AND TEXT TALK NUMBER FOR THE 15 STATEWIDE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CRISIS RESPONSE SYSTEM, COMMONLY 16 REFERRED TO AS "COLORADO CRISIS SERVICES", AS DESCRIBED IN SECTION 17 27-60-104, and the national three-digit suicide and crisis lifeline 18 NUMBER 988. THE PUBLIC OR PRIVATE POSTSECONDARY SCHOOL MAY 19 INCLUDE INFORMATION ABOUT OTHER AVAILABLE CRISIS SERVICES AND 20 OTHER SERVICES ON THE IDENTIFICATION CARD, INCLUDING LOCAL 21 CAMPUS CRISIS AND SUICIDE PREVENTION NUMBERS. THE PUBLIC OR 22 PRIVATE POSTSECONDARY SCHOOL IS NOT REQUIRED TO REPRINT OR 23 REISSUE IDENTIFICATION CARDS IN USE BEFORE AUGUST 1, 2023. IF, AT 24 ANY TIME, A PRIVATE OR PUBLIC POSTSECONDARY SCHOOL HAS CURRENT 25 STUDENTS STILL USING IDENTIFICATION CARDS WITHOUT THE 26 INFORMATION REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION, THE SCHOOL SHALL DISTRIBUTE 27 THE PHONE NUMBER AND TEXT TALK NUMBER FOR COLORADO CRISIS

1 SERVICES, AS DESCRIBED IN SECTION 27-60-104, AND THE NATIONAL 2 THREE-DIGIT SUICIDE AND CRISIS LIFELINE NUMBER 988 TO ALL STUDENTS 3 AT THE BEGINNING OF EACH SCHOOL SEMESTER OR TRIMESTER UNTIL ALL 4 STUDENTS HAVE IDENTIFICATION CARDS WITH THE REQUIRED 5 INFORMATION. IF A PRIVATE OR PUBLIC POSTSECONDARY SCHOOL DOES 6 NOT ISSUE OR USE STUDENT IDENTIFICATION CARDS, THE SCHOOL SHALL 7 DISTRIBUTE THE PHONE NUMBER AND TEXT TALK NUMBER FOR COLORADO 8 CRISIS SERVICES, AS DESCRIBED IN SECTION 27-60-104, AND THE NATIONAL 9 THREE-DIGIT SUICIDE AND CRISIS LIFELINE NUMBER 988 TO ALL STUDENTS 10 AT THE BEGINNING OF EACH SCHOOL SEMESTER OR TRIMESTER. 11 **SECTION 3.** Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,

determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediatepreservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
