## A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING THE CREATION OF THE ADVANCED INDUSTRIES WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM.

## **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill creates the advanced industries workforce development program in the Colorado office of economic development (office). The purpose of the program is to allow the office to reimburse a business for one-half of its expenses related to a qualifying internship or apprenticeship. A qualifying internship or apprenticeship is one that:

- ! Is in an advanced industry;
- ! Is for at least 160 hours and that lasts less than one year;
- ! Allows students to gain valuable work experience in at least 3 specified occupational areas;
- ! Pays the intern or apprentice a stipend;
- ! Provides a mentor or supervisor that will work closely with the intern or apprentice;
- ! Is not for the purpose of meeting required residency or clinical hours for the intern;
- ! Is with an advanced industry business that has a physical operation facility in the state;
- ! Is for a high-school or college student, a resident who is a student at an out-of-state college, or a recent grad of either; and
- ! Along with all other internships and apprenticeships, constitutes less than 50% of the business's workforce located in the state.

A business may be reimbursed for up to 5 interns and apprentices per location and up to 10 at all locations, but the maximum amount that a business may be reimbursed for each internship or apprenticeship is \$5,000, of which no more than \$2,500 may be for a stipend paid to the intern or apprentice. The office is required to contract with multiple intermediaries, which are advanced industry associations, to facilitate the program administration. The office may permit an intermediary to:

- ! Match an intern or apprentice with a business;
- ! Identify qualifying internships and apprenticeships;
- Submit reimbursement applications to the office;
- ! Provide assessments of the program to the office; and
- ! Identify job placement for the interns and apprentices.

For the next 3 fiscal years, the general assembly is required to annually appropriate \$450,000 from the general fund to the office for program reimbursements. The general assembly is also required to make a general fund appropriation to the office for program administration expenses.

The office is required to solicit information about apprenticeships and internships that were reimbursed through the program and to submit a report to legislative committees about the program.

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1	(3) (a) THE ADVANCED INDUSTRIES WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT
2	PROGRAM IS CREATED IN THE COLORADO OFFICE OF ECONOMIC
3	DEVELOPMENT. BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2014, THE OFFICE MAY
4	REIMBURSE A BUSINESS FOR UP TO ONE-HALF OF ITS EXPENSES RELATED TO
5	A QUALIFYING INTERNSHIP OR APPRENTICESHIP, SUBJECT TO AVAILABLE
6	APPROPRIATIONS. A BUSINESS MAY BE REIMBURSED FOR UP TO FIVE
7	INTERNS AND APPRENTICES PER LOCATION AND UP TO TEN INTERNS AND
8	APPRENTICES TOTAL AT ALL LOCATIONS, BUT THE MAXIMUM AMOUNT
9	THAT A BUSINESS MAY BE REIMBURSED FOR EACH INTERNSHIP OR
10	APPRENTICESHIP IS FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS, OF WHICH NO MORE THAN
11	TWO THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS MAY BE FOR A STIPEND PAID TO

13	OR APPRENTICESHIP FOR WHICH THE BUSINESS SEEKS REIMBURSEMENT.
14	(4) (a) TO QUALIFY FOR REIMBURSEMENT, AN APPRENTICESHIP OR
15	INTERNSHIP MUST:
16	(I) BE IN AN ADVANCED INDUSTRY;
17	(II) BE FOR AT LEAST ONE HUNDRED SIXTY HOURS AND LAST LESS
18	THAN ONE YEAR;
19	(III) ALLOW STUDENTS TO GAIN VALUABLE WORK EXPERIENCE IN
20	AT LEAST THREE OF THE FOLLOWING OCCUPATIONAL AREAS:
21	(A) COMPUTER SYSTEMS, INCLUDING SOFTWARE DEVELOPMENT
22	AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SUPPORT;
23	(B) PRODUCTION, INCLUDING FABRICATION AND ASSEMBLY;
24	(C) Engineering, including product design, testing, and
25	DEVELOPMENT;
26	(D) BUSINESS AND FINANCIAL OPERATIONS, INCLUDING SUPPLY

5	(G) EXECUTIVE MANAGEMENT AND BUSINESS STRATEGY;
6	(IV) PAY THE INTERN OR APPRENTICE A STIPEND;
7	(V) PROVIDE A MENTOR OR SUPERVISOR THAT WILL WORK
8	CLOSELY WITH THE INTERN;
9	(VI) NOT BE FOR THE PURPOSE OF MEETING REQUIRED RESIDENCY

18	(b) TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR REIMBURSEMENT, A BUSINESS MUST BE IN
19	AN ADVANCED INDUSTRY AND HAVE A PHYSICAL OPERATION FACILITY IN
20	THE STATE. THE BUSINESS MAY BE A FOR-PROFIT OR NON-PROFIT
21	ORGANIZATION, BUT MAY NOT BE A GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY OR AN
22	INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION.
23	(c) (I) TO BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN AN INTERNSHIP OR
24	APPRENTICESHIP IN THE PROGRAM, A PERSON MUST BE:
25	(A) ENROLLED FULL-TIME IN A SECONDARY SCHOOL OR AS AN
26	UNDERGRADUATE AT AN INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN THE
27	STATE;

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1	(B) A RESIDENT OF THE STATE WHO IS ENROLLED AS A FULL-TIME
2	UNDERGRADUATE AT AN INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION OUTSIDE OF
3	THE STATE; OR
4	(C) A GRADUATE FROM A SCHOOL OR INSTITUTION LISTED IN
5	SUB-SUBPARAGRAPHS (A) AND (B) OF THIS SUBPARAGRAPH (I), IF THE
6	INTERNSHIP OR APPRENTICESHIP BEGINS WITHIN SIX MONTHS OF
7	GRADUATION.
8	(II) IF THERE ARE MORE APPLICANTS THAN CAN BE REIMBURSED,
9	THE OFFICE SHALL GIVE PREFERENCE TO A BUSINESS THAT HAD AN INTERN
10	OR APPRENTICE WHO IS:
11	(A) IN A CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION PROGRAM;
12	(B) Pursuing industry-endorsed certificates;
13	(C) ENROLLED IN TECHNOLOGY-RELATED,
14	MANUFACTURING-RELATED, OR ENGINEERING-RELATED ASSOCIATES OF
15	APPLIED SCIENCE DEGREE PROGRAMS; OR
16	(D) PURSUING A DEGREE IN THE CATEGORIES OF SCIENCE,
17	TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING, OR MATHEMATICS.
18	(5) (a) AFTER THE COMPLETION OF A PROGRAM INTERNSHIP OR
19	APPRENTICESHIP, THE OFFICE SHALL SURVEY THE BUSINESS AND
20	PARTICIPANT ABOUT THEIR EXPERIENCE. TO THE EXTENT REASONABLE,
21	THE OFFICE SHALL TAKE STEPS TO IDENTIFY JOB PLACEMENT FOR THE
22	INTERNS AND APPRENTICES.
23	(b) On or before November 1, 2015, and November 1 of the
24	NEXT TWO YEARS THEREAFTER, THE OFFICE SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT TO
25	THE FINANCE AND THE BUSINESS, LABOR, ECONOMIC, AND WORKFORCE
26	DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEES OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND TO

13	(7) This section is repealed, effective July 1, 2020.
14	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
15	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate

preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

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
