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**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

101      **CONCERNING THE RETAIL FOOD ESTABLISHMENT INSPECTION**  
102              **PROCESS, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, DETAILING THE**  
103              **PROCESS FOR THE SUSPENSION OF A RETAIL FOOD**  
104              **ESTABLISHMENT'S LICENSE OR CERTIFICATION OF LICENSE.**

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**Bill Summary**

With respect to retail food establishment inspections, the bill:  
!      Clarifies the situations that can create an "imminent health hazard";

- ! Repeals language that separated violations found during inspections into critical and noncritical violations;
- ! Clarifies that it is unlawful to continue to operate a retail food establishment that has had its license or certificate of license suspended;
- ! Aligns the requirements for the communication of inspection results with the determination of whether violations are sufficient to require a reinspection;
- ! Removes the minimum amount for a civil penalty and establishes the maximum amount as \$1,000;
- ! Provides that a retail food establishment that is found to be in violation during 4 out of 5 inspections during a 12-month period is subject to a civil penalty not to exceed \$1,000 and license suspension; and
- ! Adds unpaid license fees to the list of items on which a retail food establishment can spend an assessed penalty.

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1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-4-1602, **amend**  
3 (6.5) as follows:

4 **25-4-1602. Definitions.** As used in this part 16, unless the context  
5 otherwise requires:

6 (6.5) (a) "Imminent health hazard" means a significant threat or  
7 danger to health that is considered to exist when there is evidence  
8 sufficient to show that a product, practice, circumstance, or event creates  
9 a situation that requires immediate correction or cessation of operation to  
10 prevent injury or illness based on the number of potential injuries or  
11 illnesses and the nature, severity, and duration of the anticipated injury or  
12 illness.

13 (b) "IMMINENT HEALTH HAZARD" INCLUDES AN EMERGENCY SUCH  
14 AS A FIRE, FLOOD, EXTENDED INTERRUPTION OF ELECTRICAL OR WATER  
15 SERVICE, SEWAGE BACKUP, MISUSE OF POISONOUS OR TOXIC MATERIALS,  
16 ONSET OF AN APPARENT FOOD-BORNE ILLNESS OUTBREAK, GROSSLY

1 UNSANITARY OCCURRENCE OR CONDITION, OR OTHER CIRCUMSTANCE  
2 THAT MAY ENDANGER PUBLIC HEALTH.

3 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-4-1604, **amend**  
4 (1) introductory portion and (1)(a) as follows:

5 **25-4-1604. Powers and duties of department - rules.** (1) The  
6 department ~~shall have~~ HAS the following powers and duties:

7 (a) To grant or refuse licenses and certificates of license pursuant  
8 to section 25-4-1606, or to suspend or revoke licenses and certificates of  
9 license pursuant to section ~~25-4-1609~~ 25-4-1611.5;

10 **SECTION 3.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-4-1606, **amend**  
11 (2.5) as follows:

12 **25-4-1606. Licensure - exception.** (2.5) If ~~a critical violation or~~  
13 ~~a noncritical violation that is significant in nature is documented~~ THE  
14 APPLICANT IS FOUND TO BE IN VIOLATION OF SECTION 25-4-1610 (1)(c)  
15 during a preoperational inspection, and the ~~retail food establishment~~  
16 APPLICANT is unable to correct the violation while the inspector is on site,  
17 ~~follow-up activities~~ A REINSPECTION shall be conducted for the purpose  
18 of granting a license or certificate of license.

19 **SECTION 4.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-4-1607.7, **add** (3)  
20 as follows:

21 **25-4-1607.7. Health inspection results - development of a**  
22 **uniform system - communication to the public.** (3) AFTER JANUARY  
23 1, 2020, THE SYSTEM DEVELOPED AND APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT TO  
24 COMMUNICATE INSPECTION RESULTS MAY ONLY BE REVISED THROUGH THE  
25 TRIENNIAL STAKEHOLDER PROCESS REQUIRED BY SECTION 25-4-1607.5.

26 **SECTION 5.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-4-1608, **amend**  
27 (1) as follows:

1           **25-4-1608. Food protection cash fund - creation.** (1) Fees  
2 collected by the department pursuant to section 25-4-1607 AND PENALTIES  
3 COLLECTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 25-4-1611.5 shall be transmitted to the  
4 state treasurer, who shall credit ~~the same~~ THEM to the food protection cash  
5 fund, which fund is hereby created in the state treasury. The general  
6 assembly shall appropriate the moneys in the fund to the department for  
7 the payment of salaries and expenses necessary for the administration of  
8 this part 16.

9           **SECTION 6.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **repeal** 25-4-1609 as  
10 follows:

11           **25-4-1609. Disciplinary actions - closure - revocation -**  
12 **suspension - review.** ~~(1) The department or a county or district board of~~  
13 ~~health may, on its own motion or complaint and after an investigation and~~  
14 ~~hearing at which the licensee is afforded an opportunity to be heard,~~  
15 ~~suspend or revoke a license or certificate of license for any violation of~~  
16 ~~this part 16, any rule adopted pursuant to this part 16, or any of the terms,~~  
17 ~~conditions, or provisions of such license or certificate of license. A~~  
18 ~~written notice of suspension or revocation, as well as any required notice~~  
19 ~~of hearing, shall be sent to the licensee by certified mail, or by one or~~  
20 ~~more other methods that assure receipt, at the address contained in the~~  
21 ~~license or certificate of license.~~

22           ~~(2) Except in cases of closure due to an imminent health hazard,~~  
23 ~~proceedings for the revocation or suspension of a license or certificate of~~  
24 ~~license may not be commenced until after the imposition of the penalties~~  
25 ~~prescribed by section 25-4-1611. The maximum period of suspension is~~  
26 ~~one month. When a license or certificate of license is suspended or~~  
27 ~~revoked, no part of the fees paid for a license may be returned to the~~

1 licensee.

2 ~~(2.5) The department or a county or district board of health may~~  
3 ~~issue a cease-and-desist administrative order if a person or licensee has~~  
4 ~~been issued a civil penalty in accordance with section 25-4-1611 (1) and~~  
5 ~~remains in noncompliance.~~

6 ~~(3) Any suspension or revocation of a license or certificate of~~  
7 ~~license may be reviewed by any court of general jurisdiction having~~  
8 ~~jurisdiction over the retail food establishment for which the application~~  
9 ~~for license or certificate of license was made. If such court determines~~  
10 ~~that such suspension or revocation was without good cause, it shall order~~  
11 ~~the department to reinstate such license or certificate of license.~~

12 **SECTION 7.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-4-1610, **amend**  
13 (1)(b) as follows:

14 **25-4-1610. Unlawful acts.** (1) It is unlawful for:

15 (b) Any person to operate a retail food establishment without a  
16 valid license or certificate of license from the department or a county or  
17 district ~~board of~~ PUBLIC health AGENCY having jurisdiction over such  
18 establishment, INCLUDING CONTINUING TO OPERATE A RETAIL FOOD  
19 ESTABLISHMENT THAT HAS HAD ITS LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE OF LICENSE  
20 SUSPENDED IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 25-4-1611.5;

21 **SECTION 8.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **repeal** 25-4-1611 as  
22 follows:

23 **25-4-1611. Violation - penalties.** ~~(1) If the department or a~~  
24 ~~county or district board of health finds that a licensee or other person~~  
25 ~~operating a retail food establishment was provided with written~~  
26 ~~notification of a violation of section 25-4-1610 (1)(a), (1)(b), (1)(d),~~  
27 ~~(1)(e), or (1)(f) and was given a reasonable time to comply but remained~~

1 in noncompliance, such person shall be subject to a civil penalty of not  
2 less than two hundred fifty dollars and not more than one thousand  
3 dollars, assessed by the department or a county or district board of health.

4 (2) (a) Upon a finding by the department or a county or district  
5 board of health that a retail food establishment is in violation of this part  
6 16 or the rules promulgated pursuant to this part 16, and that the violation  
7 is sufficient to permit the department or a county or district board of  
8 health to establish a date and time for correction, the department or  
9 county or district board of health shall, in writing, advise the licensee or  
10 other person operating the establishment of the violation, provide the  
11 person with a reasonable time to comply, and conduct a follow-up  
12 inspection. If, at the time of the follow-up inspection, the establishment  
13 is found to be in violation of the same provisions, the department or a  
14 county or district board of health shall issue the person a written  
15 notification of noncompliance, provide the person with a reasonable time  
16 to comply, and conduct a second follow-up inspection.

17 (b) (I) If, at a second follow-up inspection, a retail food  
18 establishment is found to be in compliance with the same provisions as  
19 were cited in the written notification issued pursuant to paragraph (a) of  
20 this subsection (2), the department or a county or district board of health  
21 shall advise the licensee or other person operating the establishment that  
22 noncompliance with such provisions at the next regular inspection shall  
23 result in the issuance of a second written notification of noncompliance.

24 (II) If, at a second follow-up inspection, a retail food  
25 establishment is found to be in violation of the same provisions as were  
26 cited in the written notification of noncompliance issued pursuant to  
27 paragraph (a) of this subsection (2), the department or a county or district

22 ~~board of health may assess a civil penalty of not less than five hundred~~

11 (4) ~~Neither the department nor a county or district board of health~~  
12 ~~shall assess a civil penalty pursuant to this section if a disciplinary action~~  
13 ~~is pending against the same licensee under section 25-4-1609.~~

14 (5) (a) ~~All penalties collected by the department pursuant to this~~  
15 ~~section shall be transmitted to the state treasurer, who shall credit the~~  
16 ~~same to the food protection cash fund created in section 25-4-1608.~~

17 (b) ~~Penalties collected by a county or district board of health shall~~  
18 ~~be deposited in the appropriate county or district public health agency~~  
19 ~~fund in accordance with section 25-4-1608, and shall be used to pay~~  
20 ~~expenses related to the inspection of retail food establishments.~~

21 (6) ~~To obtain compliance with this part 16, the department or a~~

6 **25-4-1611.5. Violations - penalties - review.** (1) IF THE  
7 DEPARTMENT OR A COUNTY OR DISTRICT PUBLIC HEALTH AGENCY FINDS  
8 THAT A LICENSEE OR OTHER PERSON OPERATING A RETAIL FOOD  
9 ESTABLISHMENT WAS PROVIDED WITH WRITTEN NOTIFICATION OF A  
10 VIOLATION OF SECTION 25-4-1610 (1)(a), (1)(b), (1)(d), (1)(e), OR (1)(f)  
11 AND WAS GIVEN A REASONABLE TIME TO COMPLY BUT REMAINED IN  
12 NONCOMPLIANCE, THE PERSON IS SUBJECT TO A CIVIL PENALTY OF NOT  
13 LESS THAN TWO HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS AND NOT MORE THAN ONE  
14 THOUSAND DOLLARS, ASSESSED BY THE DEPARTMENT OR COUNTY OR  
15 DISTRICT PUBLIC HEALTH AGENCY.

16 (2) (a) (I) UPON A FINDING BY THE DEPARTMENT OR A COUNTY OR  
17 DISTRICT PUBLIC HEALTH AGENCY THAT AN ESTABLISHMENT IS IN  
18 VIOLATION OF SECTION 25-4-1610 (1)(c), AND THAT THE VIOLATIONS ARE  
19 SUFFICIENT TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OR COUNTY OR DISTRICT PUBLIC  
20 HEALTH AGENCY TO CONDUCT A REINSPECTION, THE DEPARTMENT OR  
21 COUNTY OR DISTRICT PUBLIC HEALTH AGENCY SHALL PROVIDE THE  
22 ESTABLISHMENT WITH A REASONABLE TIME TO COMPLY AND CONDUCT A  
23 REINSPECTION.

24 (II) FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SUBSECTION (2)(a), THE  
25 DETERMINATION OF WHETHER A VIOLATION OF SECTION 25-4-1610 (1)(c)  
26 IS SUFFICIENT TO REQUIRE REINSPECTION UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL BE  
27 DONE IN A MANNER CONSISTENT WITH THE UNIFORM SYSTEM TO

1 COMMUNICATE INSPECTION RESULTS TO THE PUBLIC DEVELOPED IN  
2 ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 25-4-1607.7.

3 (b) IF, AT THE TIME OF THE FIRST REINSPECTION, THE  
4 ESTABLISHMENT IS IN VIOLATION OF SECTION 25-4-1610 (1)(c) AND THE  
5 VIOLATIONS ARE SUFFICIENT TO REQUIRE REINSPECTION, THE DEPARTMENT  
6 OR COUNTY OR DISTRICT PUBLIC HEALTH AGENCY SHALL CONDUCT A  
7 SECOND REINSPECTION AFTER PROVIDING THE ESTABLISHMENT A  
8 REASONABLE TIME TO COMPLY.

9 (c) IF, AT THE TIME OF THE SECOND REINSPECTION, THE  
10 ESTABLISHMENT REMAINS IN VIOLATION OF SECTION 25-4-1610 (1)(c) AND  
11 THE VIOLATIONS ARE SUFFICIENT TO REQUIRE REINSPECTION, THE  
12 DEPARTMENT OR COUNTY OR DISTRICT PUBLIC HEALTH AGENCY SHALL  
13 CONDUCT A THIRD REINSPECTION AFTER PROVIDING THE ESTABLISHMENT  
14 A REASONABLE TIME TO COMPLY.

15 (d) IF, AT A THIRD REINSPECTION, THE ESTABLISHMENT REMAINS  
16 IN VIOLATION OF SECTION 25-4-1610 (1)(c), THE DEPARTMENT OR COUNTY  
17 OR DISTRICT PUBLIC HEALTH AGENCY MAY ASSESS A CIVIL PENALTY, NOT  
18 TO EXCEED ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS, AND MAY SUSPEND THE LICENSE OF  
19 THE LICENSEE PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION.

20 (e) IF AN ESTABLISHMENT IS FOUND TO BE IN VIOLATION OF  
21 SECTION 25-4-1610 (1)(c) DURING FOUR OUT OF FIVE INSPECTIONS DURING  
22 A TWELVE-MONTH PERIOD AND THE VIOLATIONS ARE SUFFICIENT TO  
23 REQUIRE REINSPECTION, THE DEPARTMENT OR COUNTY OR DISTRICT  
24 PUBLIC HEALTH AGENCY MAY ASSESS A CIVIL PENALTY, NOT TO EXCEED  
25 ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS, AND MAY SUSPEND THE LICENSE OF THE  
26 LICENSEE PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION.

27 (3) A MAXIMUM OF THREE CIVIL PENALTIES MAY BE ASSESSED

1 AGAINST A LICENSEE OR OTHER PERSON OPERATING AN ESTABLISHMENT  
2 IN ANY TWELVE-MONTH PERIOD. WHENEVER A THIRD CIVIL PENALTY IS  
3 ASSESSED IN A TWELVE-MONTH PERIOD, THE DEPARTMENT OR COUNTY OR  
4 DISTRICT PUBLIC HEALTH AGENCY MAY INITIATE PROCEEDINGS TO  
5 SUSPEND OR REVOKE THE LICENSE OF THE LICENSEE PURSUANT TO THIS  
6 SECTION.

7 (4) NEITHER THE DEPARTMENT NOR COUNTY OR DISTRICT PUBLIC  
8 HEALTH AGENCY SHALL ASSESS A CIVIL PENALTY PURSUANT TO THIS  
9 SECTION IF A DISCIPLINARY ACTION IS PENDING AGAINST THE SAME  
10 LICENSEE UNDER THIS SECTION.

11 (5) (a) ALL PENALTIES COLLECTED BY THE DEPARTMENT  
12 PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION SHALL BE TRANSMITTED TO THE STATE  
13 TREASURER, WHO SHALL CREDIT THEM TO THE FOOD PROTECTION CASH  
14 FUND CREATED IN SECTION 25-4-1608.

15 (b) PENALTIES COLLECTED BY A COUNTY OR DISTRICT PUBLIC  
16 HEALTH AGENCY SHALL BE DEPOSITED IN THE APPROPRIATE COUNTY OR  
17 DISTRICT PUBLIC HEALTH AGENCY FUND IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION  
18 25-4-1608.

19 (6) TO OBTAIN COMPLIANCE WITH THIS PART 16, THE DEPARTMENT  
20 OR COUNTY OR DISTRICT PUBLIC HEALTH AGENCY MAY ALLOW THE OWNER  
21 OF AN ESTABLISHMENT TO USE ANY ASSESSED PENALTY FEE TO PAY FOR  
22 UNPAID LICENSE FEES, EMPLOYEE TRAINING, OR THE COST OF NEEDED  
23 IMPROVEMENTS TO THE ESTABLISHMENT.

24 (7) IN ADDITION TO THE REMEDIES PROVIDED IN THIS PART 16 AND  
25 OTHER REMEDIES PROVIDED BY LAW, THE DEPARTMENT OR COUNTY OR  
26 DISTRICT PUBLIC HEALTH AGENCY IS AUTHORIZED TO APPLY TO THE  
27 COUNTY OR DISTRICT COURT WITH JURISDICTION FOR THE COUNTY WHERE

1 AN ESTABLISHMENT IS LOCATED FOR A TEMPORARY OR PERMANENT  
2 INJUNCTION, AND SUCH COURT SHALL HAVE JURISDICTION TO ISSUE AN  
3 INJUNCTION RESTRAINING ANY PERSON FROM VIOLATING SECTION  
4 25-4-1610.

5 (8) THE DEPARTMENT OR COUNTY OR DISTRICT PUBLIC HEALTH  
6 AGENCY MAY ISSUE A CEASE-AND-DESIST ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER IF A  
7 PERSON OR LICENSEE HAS BEEN ISSUED A CIVIL PENALTY IN ACCORDANCE  
8 WITH SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION AND REMAINS IN NONCOMPLIANCE.

9 (9) (a) THE DEPARTMENT OR COUNTY OR DISTRICT PUBLIC HEALTH  
10 AGENCY MAY SUSPEND OR REVOKE A LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE OF LICENSE  
11 FOR ANY VIOLATION OF THIS PART 16, ANY RULE ADOPTED PURSUANT TO  
12 THIS PART 16, OR ANY OF THE TERMS, CONDITIONS, OR PROVISIONS OF THE  
13 LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE OF LICENSE IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION  
14 24-4-104.

15 (b) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (9)(c) OF THIS SECTION,  
16 THE SUSPENSION OF A LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE OF LICENSE MAY NOT  
17 EXCEED THREE DAYS AND MAY COMMENCE ONLY:

18 (I) AFTER ALL REINSPECTIONS REQUIRED BY SUBSECTION (2) OF  
19 THIS SECTION HAVE BEEN COMPLETED;

20 (II) IF THE LICENSEE REMAINS IN VIOLATION; AND

21 (III) AFTER THE LICENSEE HAS BEEN PROVIDED WRITTEN  
22 NOTIFICATION OF THE GRIEVANCE PROCESS AVAILABLE PURSUANT TO  
23 SECTION 25-4-1609.5.

24 (c) IN CASES OF IMMINENT HEALTH HAZARD, THE SUSPENSION OF  
25 A LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE OF LICENSE MAY COMMENCE IMMEDIATELY.

26 (d) WHEN A LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE OF LICENSE IS SUSPENDED  
27 UNDER THIS SUBSECTION (9), NO PART OF THE FEES PAID FOR A LICENSE

1 MAY BE RETURNED TO THE LICENSEE.

2 (10) AN ESTABLISHMENT THAT HAS BEEN ISSUED A  
3 CEASE-AND-DESIST ORDER OR HAD ITS LICENSE SUSPENDED OR REVOKED  
4 IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (8) OR (9) OF THIS SECTION, AS  
5 APPLICABLE, MAY NOT REINITIATE OPERATIONS WITHOUT THE PRIOR  
6 APPROVAL OF THE DEPARTMENT OR COUNTY OR DISTRICT PUBLIC HEALTH  
7 AGENCY.

8 **SECTION 10. Act subject to petition - effective date -**  
9 **applicability.** (1) This act takes effect January 1, 2020; except that, if a  
10 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the  
11 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act  
12 within the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general  
13 assembly, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless  
14 approved by the people at the general election to be held in November  
15 2020 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the official  
16 declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

17 (2) This act applies to conduct occurring on or after the applicable  
18 effective date of this act.
