Bill Summary

The bill continues the forest restoration program, and its associated funding from severance taxes, for 5 years and specifies that the program is no longer a pilot program. The bill also extends for 5 years the annual transfers from the operational account of the severance tax trust fund of \$1.45 million to the healthy forests and vibrant communities fund and

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 1 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-31-310, amend 3 (6), (8), (8.5), and (9); and **repeal** (7) as follows: 4 23-31-310. Forest restoration program - definitions - technical 5 advisory panel - repeal. (6) Proposal selection. After consulting with 6 the technical advisory panel established in subsection (5) of this section, 7 the forest service shall select the proposals that will receive funding 8 through this section. 10	services and operating expenses.

13	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
14	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

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
